national resources conservation message to congress, another on hours and wages, etc. This was broadcast generally.

However, just as a tip, if you will look into the national resources conservation message, you will find the lost power message. Aside from containing some minor points about soil conservation, it was written to contain major points about a survey looking toward establishment of eight other TVA's around the country.

In the end, therefore, it may develop that this inaccuracy is on the White House for calling a power message a national resource message.

Mr. Roosevelt's unofficial attorney-general, Tom Corcoran, appeared behind the senate scenes the other day to take charge of compromise negotiations.

Static Cause of Zep Loss, Echenner LAKEHURST, N. J., May 22-(AP)-Dr. Hugo Echenner, the veteran master of dirigibles, called the Hindenburg disaster "extremely mysterious," today and gave the commerce department investigating board his opinion that a spark of static electricity ignited free hydrogen in her stern and caused her flaming destruction.

"I am convinced by some happenings still unexplained," he said, "that a leak must have suddenly originated aft by which gas could accumulate."

"Gas escaped upward and filled the space between the outer cover and the aft gas cells of the ship, and was ignited by a static spark as we have assumed in theory."

Speed Yaquina Project WASHINGTON, May 22-(AP)-Possibility of speeding authorization of proposed improvements of Yaquina bay bridge by a year by offering the half-million dollar project as an amendment to the rivers and harbors bill was discussed by the house rivers and harbors committee.

RARE OPERATION TO REMOVE HALF BABE FROM CHILD

PORTLAND, Ore., May 22-(AP)-Dr. Dillehunt, dean of the University of Oregon medical school, said surgeons will attempt next week one of the rarest operations in medical history, the removal of a half-formed baby from the abdominal cavity of a healthy, 13-month-old girl.

Dr. Dillehunt said he knows of no previous record of a similar operation.

The child was brought to Portland from Douglas county for observation two weeks ago when an abdominal swelling became noticeable.

X-ray photographs revealed the embryonic skeleton located between the stomach and the rear of the abdominal cavity, a portion of a skull, and the femur and tibia bones being visible, he related.

He explained the case as a cellular division similar to that resulting in the birth of Siamese twins, except that in this instance one body was enclosed within the other. It is a parasitic growth and is not "alive" in the sense that an unborn child has life, he said.

Attending the case are Dr. Raymond E. Watkins, prominent gynecologist, and Dr. L. Howard Smith, staff surgeon of the Doernbecher hospital.

CHICAGO, May 22-(AP)-Dr. Morris Fishbein, editor of the Journal of the American Medical Association, said today the discovery of a half-formed human embryo in the body of a Portland, Ore., infant was "extraordinary but not unique."

"These things have happened every now and then," he said. "Sometimes the child is attached, as in the case of Siamese twins, sometimes a portion is outside the body in what are called 'three-legged babies' and sometimes the embryo is entirely within the infant's body as in the Oregon case. These cases are extraordinary but not unique."

San Francisco, May 22-(AP)-An increase of
