

PREMIER BALDWIN RETIRES; HIGHEST HONOR FROM KING

"Honest Stan" Succeeded by Chamberlain in British Cabinet Change — Still Coalition Administration

LONDON, May 26.—(AP)—Stanley Baldwin, "savior of the monarchy," retired today as Great Britain's prime minister after historic service and was succeeded by Arthur Neville Chamberlain, his chancellor of the exchequer.

King George VI conferred on Baldwin the highest distinction within the gift of the crown—a knighthood of the garter—tonight after the smoothly-managed switch of governments.

The king received the new national government, still a coalition administration, in a special audience at Buckingham palace after the change-over from "Honest Stan," the king-maker, to cool, efficient Chamberlain, "as practical as a plumber."

Chamberlain quickly reorganized the cabinet to fill vacancies created by Baldwin's resignation—the elevation of Walter Runciman, erstwhile president of the board of trade, to the peerage and the advance of Baldwin ministers to higher posts.

Ramsay MacDonald, former prime minister who retired as lord president of the privy council, was offered a peerage in an audience yesterday, but he turned it down so as not to hamper the career of his laborite son, Malcolm, secretary of state for the dominions.

The name of Baldwin will remain in the house of commons, but his conservative traditions will not. His son, Oliver, is a socialist member of parliament and in an article headed "My Father" in today's Daily Mail wrote:

"He has been lucky. His patience and his inborn laziness have been among his greatest assets. . . he has saved torism from reaction and thereby his country from revolution."

The honor to Baldwin, free now to retire to his books and his favorite hobby, the breeding of pigs, was given him in addition to an earldom, which he accepted for himself and his descendants.

The order of the garter dates back to King Edward III, who, in 1348, limited it to the sovereign, princes of the blood, foreign monarchs and 25 knights-companions, which Baldwin becomes.

OREGON AIR TOUR, DEMONSTRATIONS, OPEN HERE JULY 2

"We shall have the best planes, the top-rank stunt pilots, the nation's leading demonstration pilots, veteran parachute jumpers, speed planes, a wide variety of modern craft—everything that will make the show a grand spectacle."

The planes will be lined up at the airport for inspection four hours before the start of the show so that

ROUTINE DIET TO DIONNE FIVE ON THIRD BIRTHDAY

Radio Broadcast Will Bring Late Supper for Quintuplets — Papa Dionne, Still Irked, to Stay Away

CALLANDER, Ont., May 28.—(AP)—Mr. and Mrs. Olive Dionne's five famous daughters were three years old today but—save for a half-hour deviation in their supper time—it was mostly another day of oatmeal and spinach, bathing and play.

The saucer-eyed little girls, far too young to realize the passage of the third milestone in their once tenuous lives, did not have cake, ice cream or candy; they had to stick to their routine diet of milk and other body-building foods.

To make way for a public ceremony and a late afternoon radio broadcast in which Marie, Cecile, Yvonne and Annette were impromptu to sing and talk, the quint's supper time was moved back until after 6 o'clock instead of between 5:30 and 6.

The master of ceremonies was Dr. Allan Defoe, who three years ago

lifted the blanket from the infants in a laundry basket near the Dionne kitchen stove and grimly set about the task of saving at least one tiny life.

The country physician had concentrated on saving their mother, Elzire Dionne, because he thought he had no chance with the premature babies.

Today the girls have learned to feed themselves and brush their own teeth. Their weights average 30 pounds, five ounces.

They do not talk so well but have mastered a French-Canadian song, "En Rouillant Ma Boule."

Mr. and Mrs. Dionne were not expected to attend the public ceremony today in the quint's completely equipped hospital home.

Friends said Papa and Mama Dionne believed their attendance at the public celebration might be considered an indication that they endorse the separation of the quintes from the rest of the large family.
