

BANKER'S SHIP IN PACIFIC REACHED BY SEA HOSPITAL

George F. Baker, New York Financier, Reported out of Danger After Mercy Dash by Hospital Ship

ABOARD CUTTER TANEY IN MID-PACIFIC. May 28.—(P)—George F. Baker, one of the world's wealthiest men, was reported out of immediate danger today after a floating hospital contacted the New York banker's yacht in mid-Pacific.

Dr. D. J. Zaugg of the United States public health service boarded the yacht Viking at 3:32 a. m. (9:22 a. m. E.S.T.) after a race to bring emergency aid to Baker, during which the cutter Taney was converted in mid-ocean into a floating hospital.

Dr. Zaugg reported no immediate blood transfusion was necessary to save the 59-year-old banker from peritonitis.

He said no attempt would be made to transfer the chairman of the First National bank of New York from his yacht to the cutter.

Dr. Zaugg will remain aboard the yacht during a 270-mile race to Honolulu. The cutter will convey the yacht into port.

Fishing searchlights of the Viking led the Taney to the yacht's side early this morning, ending the speedy mercy dash. Dr. Zaugg and available medical supplies were lowered to a small boat and five minutes later he was at Baker's bedside aboard the

yacht. Calm seas and bright moonlight facilitated the transfer. The Viking appealed for aid yesterday after Baker had undergone an emergency operation performed by Dr. W. B. Clark of the Canadian Pacific liner Niagara, which have to in answer to the Viking's plea for aid.

Last night the United States navy entered the race against death, sending a plane out from Honolulu to overtake the cutter with serum obtained after the Taney sailed with Dr. D. J. Zaugg of the United States public health service.

Sixty miles out of Honolulu, Lieut. F. C. Sutton, piloting the plane, dipped 300 feet over the Taney and dropped two specifically wrapped parcels into the water, from which they were quickly picked up by the cutter's crew.

One batch of serum was designed to permit tests of the Taney's crew, should a blood transfusion be necessary for the stricken banker.

the rounds of the inner circle. A detonation cannot be long delayed, although some expert efforts now are being made to avoid it.

Acting Vice-Chairman Stewart resigned the other day for the announced purpose of taking a better outside job, but a contributing factor was that the rooms of the commission are too small to hold some of the conflicting element. Possible successor: Ex-Congressman Driscoll of Pennsylvania.

Cooperation. Further recent British steps to ease the flowing tide of gold toward the United States are evident. They are the result of broad official hints from Washington which managed to reach the right parties in London.

Concern over gold has thus continued to wane in official quarters. In the minds of officials here, the problem is definitely tied to financial speculation in this country. That is, they now agree upon imports of gold, and primarily reflected foreign buying in the American high-grade bond markets. (Not armament buying, etc.) Since speculative activity has been moderate lately, gold imports have fallen off.

Taxes. No one seems to know anything about a new tax bill this session. Congressional fiscal leaders say they will not stand for one. At the same time, responsible treasury authorities are noticeably itching to revise administrative features of the present law. They will certainly seize any opportunity to submit a bill making important administrative changes toward the close of the session if they have reason to believe there is half a chance of getting it through.

While waiting, Treasury Secretary Morgenthau is personally comforting himself by conducting a drive on income taxpayers, checking and double checking the returns, particularly of New Yorkers. This seems to be the main subject of private discussion in the financial district.

Notes. There is talk in Texas quarters (but unconfirmable here) that son Elliott might be persuaded to run for governor of the largest state.

Treasury Secretary Morgenthau is understood to be looking for that Chesapeake & Ohio bookkeeper who made a \$50,000,000 mistake and did not discover it for five years. Mon like that are hard to find.

The Rockefeller estate will not be entirely bare. Members of the New York stock exchange are contributing the usual \$15 apiece to raise about \$20,000 death gratuity.

Individual economists differ as widely as lawyers, but even some in the new order are expressing some doubt as to whether Mr. Roosevelt is getting the right economic advice. For instance, his wages and hours message expressed the desire of putting "a floor" underneath the existing living standard by federal decree of a minimum wage level and maximum hours. There is another school of thought which holds he might let floor repairs go and turn his attention to the ceiling, with a view to adding another story to the house

HOLLYWOOD LADY WRITER HELD FOR NIGHT CLUB FUSS

NEW YORK, May 28.—(AP)—Adela Rogers St. John Hollywood scenarist and newspaper writer, and her husband, Patrick O'Toole, publicity man, were two of seven persons arrested on simple assault charges as a result of a fight early today outside Bill's Gay Nineties, a mid-Manhattan night club.

Three men were injured one seriously, in the affray, which attracted a crowd of more than 100 persons, most of them in evening clothes, three police radio cars and a hospital ambulance.

Those arrested in addition to Miss St. John and her husband were William Wright, radio commentator, who was taken to Bellevue hospital with a fractured skull; Daniel (Don) Higgins, who said he was in the publicity department of the Columbia Broadcasting system; Henry Tannen, part owner of the club; William Walsh, a host, and Charles F. (Sailor) Grande, doorman.

Cause of the fight, in which all agreed fists swung freely, was a matter of much dispute in the East 51st street police station, where all were taken. The issue was left for decision in Yorkville court today, where they were to appear.

Miss St. John said she and her party had been celebrating in honor of Wright, who was to have gone to a new position in Hollywood, and decided to "top off" the evening at the night club. They were refused admittance because the house was full, Tannen said. While they were discussing the situation, Miss St. John said, someone took a swing at her. She dodged, and the battle was on.

The party of four filed charges against the club employees, who in turn filed counter-charges. The seven were released in \$500 bail each. William Hineman, a guest of the club, provided the entire \$3,500.
