

# Paul Muni And Miriam Hopkins In War Picture Opening At Craterian

## LOUIS HAYWARD IN CAST; DRAMATIC WAR SCENES ARE SHOWN

Promising to be one of the most vital dramas of the screen, "The Women I Love," starring Paul Muni and Miriam Hopkins, with Louis Hayward leading the supporting cast, opens a three day run today at the New Craterian theatre. A domestic triangle developed amid the frenzied days of the World war on the Marne front, mounting to a sensational denouement during a spectacular air battle fought by two French aces, the heart-aches of the two men over one woman form the motive of the story.

Particular interest has been attached to Paul Muni's role, his latest screen characterization since winning the coveted Academy award.

The story concentrates on a care-free youth imbued with the martial spirit of his country, a lovely girl who steals into his heart on the eve of his departure from Paris to join a flying squadron, and a grim pilot, her husband.

When the young lieutenant arrives at the flying base, he is attached to the unsuspecting pilot as observer, and they from an "Equipage." They fly through terrifying fog, they defy the death tempo of machine-guns bulging together, they see their companions go crashing to earth in flames.

In this crucible of living death, a bond of friendship is welded that is closer than blood. One thing gives them courage to carry on against the horrors of war, the inspiration of the woman left behind. The climax comes when both men discover their mutual interest in the girl.

Included in the supporting cast are Colin Clive, Vince Barnett, Wally Albright, Paul Guilfoyle, Anita Moray, Mady Christians, and Sterling Holloway.

## FORESTRY STAFF ATTENDS SCHOOL

The whole protective force of the Rogue river national forest will attend a guard training school at the vacant Carberry CCC camp tomorrow, Tuesday and Wednesday. It was announced by H. C. Obye, assistant supervisor in charge of fire control.

Purpose of the school is to give pre-season training in fire discovery, location, control and suppression. Latest methods will be taught, with emphasis on improvement in technique developed since last year, Mr. Obye explained.

Practically the entire forest staff will attend. Mr. Obye will be in charge, with rangers serving as instructors. Ray C. Lindberg, regional training supervisor at Portland, will be an adviser.

Fifty-five men will receive the training, about 75 all told to be at the school. Five Medford Boy Scouts will attend as student observers.

A state police officer will address the school tomorrow night on law enforcement as it pertains to violations committed on the forests. On Tuesday night A. H. Banwell, manager of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce will give a talk on the recreational demands of the national forests.

A first aid demonstration will be given tomorrow night by a CCC surgeon.
