DRAGON INJURED; SIGN BELCASTRO WITH SMOLINSKI

It will be Pete Belcastro versus Joe Smolinski in the middle event of promoter Mack Lillard's weekly grappling card at the Medford Armory tonight instead of Smolinski and Black Dragon, the wrestling impresario announced today. The hated Dragon, arriving in town yesterday from Spokane, told Lillard that he couldn't go through with the match because of a badly wrenched arm received recently in the Washington city.

No amount of pressure as applied by Lillard could change the hooded one's mind, so as a last minute change, the promoter signed Belcastro, the mad Italian, as his opponent. Which is really more of a natural, fans consider, than the Dragon-Smolinski affair. The two men have hated each other for a long time, and now they will have a chance to publicly air their feeling.

The Dragon, even though he won't wrestle, will be at the ringside in full regalia. This marks the second time the hooded demon has upset the details at the last minute. Once before, he was matched with Cowboy Dude Chick, but ran out with the excuse that he wanted to get in better condition for the champion.

Belcastro has entirely recovered from the lame shoulder received in his last match, against Smolinski in Klamath Falls. The aquabundant in a riot, with the Polish Palooks copping the verdict when Pete missed a dropkick and smashed his shoulder against the edge of the ring, disabling him.

The Mad Italian has sworn by all his ancestors and others that he will give Smolinski the worst beating of his life the next time he gets him in a ring, and tonight he will have that chance. Both men are the dirtiest, most underhanded grapplers now appearing in southern Oregon, and the match is actually figured an improvement over the previously announced battle between Joe and the Dragon.

In the main event, Cowboy Chick will be tangle with a powerful wrestler who knows all the answers. In addition to being a very effective bad man, LaDus made his first appearance here last week and just about crippled Sailor Dick Trout with a devastating leg-breaker, with leverage gained from the use of the ring ropes, a highly ungentlemanly performance.

Jack Sterlich, the Austrian strongman, makes his second showing before local addicts when he faces Sailor Dick Trout in the opening match. Last week he fell before the arm-breaker of Alvin Britt, and tonight he will be meeting one of Medford's most popular grapplers. Sterlich is exceptionally strong, probably the most powerful of all those now showing their wares in the territory. He is a clean worker, and with Trout, should stage a great exhibition of wrestling as it should be done.

Promoter Lillard said today he expected a capacity house.
