## CANADA PREMIER DURING WAR, DIES

OTTAWA, Ont., June 10.—(Canadian Press)—Sir Robert L. Borden, world war prime minister of Canada, died here today at the age of 82.

Canada's "elder statesman" took a sudden turn for the worse late yesterday when signs of "acute cardiac failure" developed.

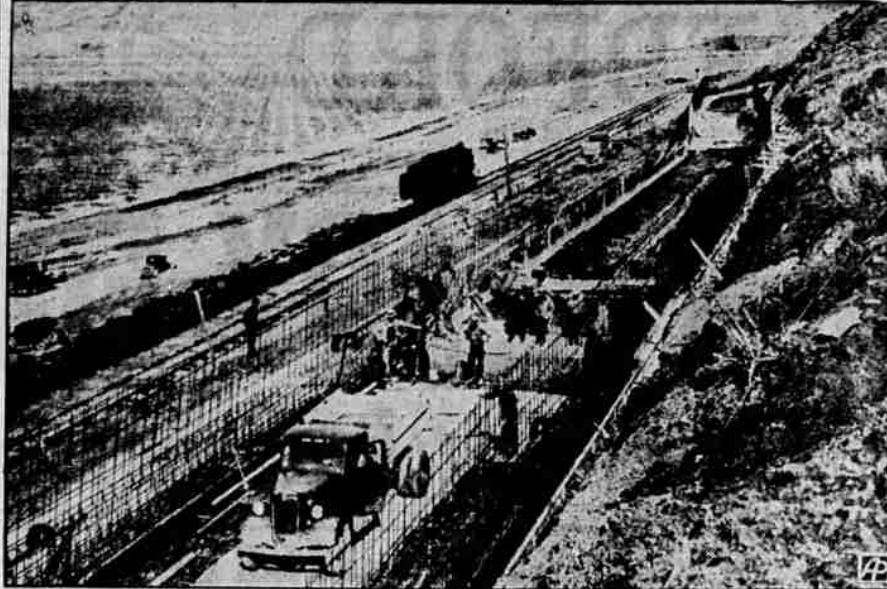
The last bulletin on the former premier, issued shortly after dawn, said he was "pretty low." Death came at 8:30 a. m., eastern standard time.

Sir Robert died at his stately colonial home on Wurttemberg street, where he had lived since before becoming prime minister.

The veteran parliamentarian entered politics as a conservative member of the house from Halifax in 1896. He succeeded Sir Wilfrid Laurier as prime minister in 1911, his tenure extended until July 10, 1920, when he resigned because of ill health.

When the United States entered the world war Sir Robert said it "sounded the death knell of German militarism."
