MARITIME UNION SENDS PRESIDENT MESSAGE ON FISH

PORTLAND, June 11. — (AP) — The Maritime Federation of the Pacific, in convention here, ordered a wire sent to President Roosevelt today, urging the chief executive to halt an alleged invasion of American fishing rights in Bristol bay, Alaska, by the Japanese. The message asserted that Pacific coast fishermen were being "robbed" of their livelihood by invasion of 26 large fishing boats and many smaller ones. It pointed out that Americans are prohibited from fishing in the waters in question until the season opens June 26, and contended the fish run would be depleted within five years if Japanese fishermen continue to operate along the Bristol banks. Another telegram, addressed to Governor Frank Murphy of Michigan, asked him to refrain from any interference with the C.I.O.'s efforts to organize the steel industry at Monroe, Mich., until operators agree to negotiate. The credentials committee, the deliberations of which have delayed business of the organization during the first five days of the convention, had not completed its work this afternoon. Among the matters to come before the body are four resolutions proposing affiliation by the federation with the C.I.O.
