

### BUTTONS ARRIVE FOR AERIAL SHOW

Buttons which are to constitute admission to the 1937 Oregon air tour and sky circus have been received by the Medford chapter of the national aeronautic association. It was announced today.

The air tour is to visit ten Oregon cities between July 2 and 11, beginning at Medford. Approximately 75 planes and 250 persons will be included in the tour.

The button badges will take the place of tickets for the show. It was pointed out. Officials of the Medford chapter urged Medford residents to purchase the buttons early in order to further publicize the tour.

Fred Heath, Jr., and L. D. Jones are in charge of advance sales of the buttons. It was observed that all highways and county roads will be closed to parking during the air show here and the only point of observation will be the Medford airport. Adequate space for spectators and cars will be provided within the airport grounds, officials said.

### RETAIL TRADE ON COAST INCREASES

SAN FRANCISCO, June 11.—(AP)—The Federal Reserve bank of San Francisco announced today retail trade in the 12th federal reserve district is maintaining a higher level than a year ago and may run slightly above average improvements for the 12 districts.

Preliminary sales reports for the month, prepared by the bank, disclosed the gain in value of sales in the district over the month last year amounted to 10 per cent, compared to a national average gain of 8 per cent.

### Portland Police, Fire Trucks Told to Cut Down Speed

PORTLAND, June 11.—(AP)—Police cars, fire trucks and ambulances were included in an order against excess speed on Portland streets issued by Chief of Police Harry Niles.

The seconds saved by careening police cars or ambulances in rushing to the scene of disaster are not worth the risk of life and limb and property damage, the practice entails, Niles warned.

### EXILED AIDE OF MUSSOLINI SLAIN

BAGNOLES, France, June 11.—(AP)—Carlo Rosselli, former Italian socialist leader who escaped from an Italian prison camp, and his brother, Sabatino Rosselli, were found mysteriously slain in a forest near here today.

The only clues were part of an improvised bomb and a dagger engraved "R" which were discovered near their bodies. Physicians started an autopsy to determine cause of death.

Carlo, who escaped from imprisonment in 1929, had been exiled to a Lipari prison island by Premier Benito Mussolini for his alleged help in the similar flight of Filippo Turati, once Il Duce's right hand man, who fell from favor and was banished.

### NUISANCE TAXES EXTENSION BEAT

WASHINGTON, June 11.—(AP)—The house beat down an attempt today to limit extension of the so-called "nuisance taxes" to one year.

An amendment to effect such a limitation was offered by Representative Dingell (D., Mich.) but lost 74 to 30, after democratic members of the ways and means committee insisted on the two-year extension provided by the bill.

Only a handful of democrats voted for Dingell's proposal although he said it would insure the drafting next fall of a "just" tax bill which would permit repeal of the nuisance taxes estimated to provide \$650,000,000.

### VANCOUVER RACE MEET ENDS FAST

VANCOUVER, Wash., June 11.—(AP)—Horse racing at the new Columbia Downs track was a thing of the past today—at least for 1937. After cutting an original five-day schedule to two days a week, operators today closed the track entirely because of poor attendance and financial losses. The season was to have run until June 30.

### WARSHIP AGROUND ON 'FRISCO FLATS

SAN FRANCISCO, June 11.—(AP)—The U. S. S. Tennessee ran aground on the mudflats off Alameda today and four powerful tugs attempted to pull the craft back into deep water.

Navy headquarters said the ship apparently suffered no damage.

The chamber of commerce marine exchange said high tide was at 3 p. m. and that efforts would be made to pull the Tennessee from the flats.

### AUTO UNION HEAD GOES 'GIGANTIC'

DETROIT, Mich., June 11.—(AP)—Homer Martin, president of the United Automobile Workers of America, announced today a "gigantic mass meeting" will be held in Monroe, Mich., Sunday afternoon to protest forcible breaking of the union picket line near the Newton Steel company's plant Thursday evening.

### EDUCATION BOARD FILE FUND PLEA

SALEM, June 11.—(AP)—The state emergency board, at its meeting here Monday, in addition to considering a request for \$15,000 to employ seven additional guards at the penitentiary and place the staff on a six-day week, will hear requests from the state board of higher education.

It was learned here the education group will ask for the diversion of \$37,000 from the general fund for the use of higher institutions of learning. The money originally was levied for the support of the schools but reverted to the general fund.

The board was scheduled to meet in the secretary of state's office here at 10 a. m. Monday.

BIRMINGHAM, Mich., June 11.—(AP)—Big Ed Dudley of Philadelphia and Augusta, Ga., burned up the Oakland Hills course this afternoon with sub-par golf in a sensational bid for commanding leadership at the 36-hole or halfway stage of the U. S. open golf championship.

Out in 34, two under par, after his first-round 70, Dudley was four under par through the 18th. He had shaken off his playing companion and closest rival, Frank Walsh of Chicago, by two strokes at that point and needed only a par finish for a record 68 and total of 138.

Dudley's spurt came with Harry Cooper of Chicago, Frankie Strafaci, 21-year-old Brooklyn public links star, and Stamin' Sam Snead on top at 142 apiece.

PORTLAND, June 11.—(AP)—The semi-finals of the Oregon amateur golf championship developed into one of the closest battles in many a round today with the four players turning the 18 holes all square.
