

# Guidahl 'Broke' Year Ago, Smashes Record to Win National Open

## THREE UNDER PAR LAST 18 HOLES TO WIN BY 2 STROKES

### Chicago Auto Salesman Noses Out Sam Sneed—Cruiickshank Third

BIRMINGHAM, Mich., June 12.—(UP) Ralph Guidahl of Chicago, who a year ago was so disgusted with his game that he turned to selling automobiles for a living, tonight won the 61st national open golf championship with a record-smashing 72-hole aggregate of 281.

With 10,000 spectators following in his wake, Guidahl swept around the final 18 holes of golf's greatest test in a three-under par 69 to beat Sam Sneed of West Virginia by two strokes, and clip one from the open mark established last year by Tony Monero.

When he ran down the final putt—when he was one of about the same length that he missed to give Johnny Goodman the 1933 open title—Guidahl was engulfed by the throng of well-wishers. But he had a thought but for one person.

"Where's my wife?" he shrieked.

"Where's my wife?" she shrieked.

Through the mob into his arms and there they stood—the couple which a year ago were borrowing money for food.

Two shots behind Sneed, in third place with 283, was the veteran campaigner, "Wee Wee" Cruiickshank of Richmond, Va., and one stroke behind him was "Lighthouse" Harry Cooper, the man who always comes so close but never wins.

Guidahl won more than the title and \$1000 with his victory. He also clinched a place on the American Ryder cup team, which sails next week for England and the international series.

Guidahl took the blue ribbon of the fairways with three rounds that broke par, and one that equaled it. On the opening day he fired a 71, and followed it on the second with a 69 on one of the longest, toughest courses in the country. He "slipped" to an even par 70 the morning after, and started the final round tied with Sneed at 212, and one stroke behind the leader, big Ed Dudley of Philadelphia.

In that afternoon run down the stretch Guidahl gave one of the finest exhibitions of courage and skill under fire that any golf championship has ever seen. He had barely started out when he was informed that Sneed had hit the turn in par 35 and was going strong.

So he turned on the heat. After five straight pars he set his sights on a 50-foot putt for a birdie on the sixth and it rolled in. He lost it back on the next hole when he three-putted from the back of the green. But he wasn't dismayed.

On the long eighth he pounded two magnificent woods to be on the green, 35 feet from the pin, and he canned the putt for an eagle. He clipped another stroke from perfect figures with a deuce on the short ninth.

Walking to the tenth tee the crowd informed him that Sneed had finished with a 71, and that his total of 283 was up on the score board. For the next two holes it appeared that Guidahl was ready to crack. He was in the rough three times on the tenth for a bogie five, and then three-putted from the eleventh for another bogie.

By the big fellow with the cold blood of Norway wasn't finished. He fired a chip within four feet of the pin on the twelfth for a birdie and then picked up a birdie deuce on the short 13th. His tee shot missed a hole in one by less than two feet.

He certified his gameness on the 14th when his wood second hit a spectator and bounced into a trap. Unfrighted, Ralph waded into the sand and exploded perfectly to halve his par. And he parred all the others to rivet down the championship.
