DYNAMITE BLAST KIDNAPING STIR JOHNSTOWN MAYOR

Idle Workers Threaten Trouble on Youngstown, O., Front—Lewis Scored.

WASHINGTON, June 16.—(AP)—Phillip Murray, chairman of the steel workers' organizing committee, said today he would ask Secretary Perkins for federal intervention in the steel strike.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio, June 16.—(AP)—A back-to-work movement, designed to re-open the strike-tied mills of the Youngstown Sheet and Tube company, ended inconclusively today as a dynamite explosion heightened the tension on another front in the big steel strike area.

Mayor Daniel J. Shields appealed to President Roosevelt to intervene in the Youngstown steel strike to remove the murderous element that now infests the city.
