NEW YORK, June 16.—(AP)—Stocks and bonds led a quiet stock market decline in late trading today.
Discouraged by fears protracted strikes in the steel industry recovery traders allowed prices to sink fractions to around 2 points.
Early in the session a handful of selected issues attempted a mild advance but their failure to follow through served to cut the entire list from price moorings, brokers said.
Technical analysts stressed, however, that declines were registered on limited volume. Transactions approximated 700,000 shares.

MUTINY ABOARD SPANISH WARSHIP CREATE A FURORE

LA PALICCE, France, June 16.—(AP)—Government sailors on the Spanish government destroyer Cicar trained their guns on a French sloop of war in La Pallice harbor today.
French and British warships in the vicinity were alerted immediately for action.
The British destroyer Bulldog, the French destroyer Fouquet and the French sloop Epinal and Dourbroux were lined up facing the Cicar.
One hundred and sixteen refugees from besieged Bilbao were on the Spanish ship. French authorities asked the Spanish consul at La Rochelle to try and persuade the Cicar's crew to land today.
The mutiny broke out when Commander Enrique Margati and Lieutenant Vicente Araceli of the Cicar threatened them with pistols. But the officers succeeded in getting ashore under the watchful eyes of French customs officers.
Fugue port officials called on the French ship, which sped here from Brest, Mo. S. Bulldog and the French sloop, which had been cruising outside the harbor, returned to watch the Cicar. They were prepared to bring the Spaniard's crew to order quickly, should the mutineers fire their leveled guns.
