PETTINGILL BILL VOTE SHY SEVEN

PORTLAND, June 17.—(AP)—A referendum conducted by the United States chamber of commerce among its constituent members failed by seven votes to provide the two-thirds majority necessary to commit the body to support the Pettingill bill.

The measure, in effect, would eliminate the long and short haul clause from the interstate commerce act.

A similar referendum in 1932 gave a clear two-thirds vote in favor of provisions of the bill, with modifications.

The old gold standard is gone for good. It will never return in the form we knew it. The substitute system of managed currencies by individual nations is here to stay.

What will come next is co-operation among nations to improve exchange facilities and trade, without sacrificing the national monetary systems within their own borders.

An international conference will be held, possibly within six months to the year. It will merely ratify international monetary working arrangements now being effected quietly among the leading nations.
