

### EPISCOPALIANS TO HOLD ANNUAL PICNIC SUNDAY

The Episcopalians of St. Mark's parish, Medford, and Trinity parish, Ashland, will hold their annual church and Sunday school picnic at Lithia park, Ashland, next Sunday. Open air morning prayer service will be held in the park at 11 a. m. the Rev. Charles M. Gullbert, vicar of Trinity church, conducting the service.

There will be a basket dinner after the conclusion of the religious service. Coffee, sugar and cream will be provided by the committee, but all participating in the dinner are expected to bring their own uncheon.

There will be games and various sports for the younger element in attendance. Should the weather be inclement the morning prayer services will be held at Trinity church and the dinner served in the parish hall.

Everybody in the valley who are communicants of the Episcopal church or are friends of the church are cordially invited to participate in this yearly get-together picnic and celebration.

On account of the picnic at Lithia park there will be no Sunday school nor 11 o'clock services at St. Mark's next Sunday, but the 8:30 a. m. holy communion service will be held as usual.

The committee in charge of the picnic state that those who have no mode of transportation to Ashland will be accommodated by notifying the rector or any member of St. Mark's vestry.

### FREED J'VILLE MAN ORLAND RESIDENT

William J. Fields, acquitted last week of the murder of Marvin M. Mow, is making his home at the residence of his son-in-law and daughter by a former marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Don Silvea, at Orland, Cal. Mr. and Mrs. Silvea testified for Mr. Fields during his trial for the fatal shooting of Mow in the Jacksonville home of Fields' wife. It was brought out that the Silveas had taken Fields to their home last autumn to get him away "from his domestic troubles." The trouble was attributed to Mow's attentions to Mrs. Fields.

### TRIM TREE LIMBS, SCHEFFEL WARNS

The trimming of all tree limbs to a height of ten feet from street level was requested today by Fred W. Scheffel, city superintendent. Mr. Scheffel pointed out that a city ordinance provides that all shade trees must be trimmed free of obstruction to at least 10 feet above the surface of streets and alleys. He said that in numerous places in the city the limbs are hanging low over sidewalks and streets. He emphasized that the ordinance makes it mandatory for property owners or those in charge of property to keep the trees trimmed.

### New Refrigerator Proves Too Much For Frantic Bride

ROCHESTER, N. Y., June 17.—(AP)—A frantic bride called the Rochester Gas and Electric corporation complaining her new refrigerator "freezes ice cubes too fast."

Jack Sharkey, sales supervisor, said an electrician rushed to the scene and found ice cubes piled in every available pan, scattered all over the kitchen floor.

### TRIBUTE PLANNED LAST SURVIVOR, 99, OF INDIAN WARS

PORTLAND, June 17.—(AP)—A stalwart man of 99 apparently is the last survivor of Oregon's Indian wars of the 1850's. He is Capt. John W. Cullen, who was welcomed last night at a gathering of sons and daughters of the men beside whom he fought 80 years ago.

Tomorrow will be his 99th birthday and so far as friends know, he is the last of those who wrested control of the Oregon country from the Indians.

Born in Indiana, Capt. Cullen came to Oregon in 1847, walking the 2,000 miles across country. After the Indian war, he fought in the Civil war and is one of the few surviving members of the old Oregon infantry.

In tribute to him, relatives of survivors of the Indian fighters elected Capt. Cullen grand commander of their association.

### PUT SHORT WAVES IN POLICE CARS

Installation of short-wave radios in all vehicles of the state police was under way today, with a representative of the Kanadio company installing and servicing equipment in this district.

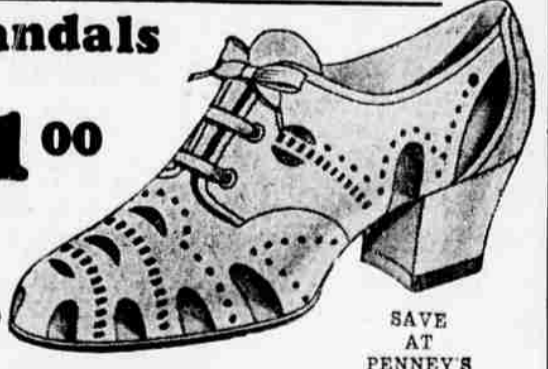
