

### DELAY SUGGESTED FOR BONNEVILLE DAM RATE STUDY

WASHINGTON, June 17. — (AP) — Chairman Mansfield of the house rivers and harbors committee said today President Roosevelt had suggested that Boulder dam rate revision amendments to the Bonneville power bill be held up pending further study and a report by January 1.

Mansfield added the pending bill setting up an administrator for Bonneville in the Columbia basin would be "overhauled" in accordance with the suggestion.

Bonneville, he said, would begin producing power in October, and it was essential that the bill be passed this session.

He said the Colorado river basin states so far had not agreed on revision of rates at Boulder, which began selling power June 1, and that pending a study, perhaps by the federal power commission, the Bonneville measure would be pressed.

Several members of congress from states around Boulder dam have protested that if Bonneville rates are based on a lower proportionate construction cost than at Boulder, industries would be taken away from the Boulder region.

### GOLDEN JUBILEE STATE PUBLISHER BODY TO CONVENT

LA GRANDE, Ore., June 17.—(AP)—The golden jubilee convention of the Oregon Newspaper Publishers association will get under way here this evening with a board of directors dinner meeting, but the formal opening session will not be held until tomorrow morning.

Following group breakfasts Friday, registration and the first general session will take place in the Sacajawea hotel, convention headquarters. Hugh McEltra, Forest Grove News-Times, president of the association, will conduct the session with Ernest R. Ringo, city manager of La Grande, to deliver the welcoming address.

Three addresses, viewing progress in Oregon newspapers from 1887 to the present—and then a glimpse into the future, will conclude the morning program. Dean Eric W. Allen of the school of journalism of the University of Oregon, will speak on "Oregon Newspapers in 1887," George Putnam, editor and publisher of the Salem Capital Journal, will discuss "Changes Wrought in Fifty Years," and Robert P. Holliday, president of the West-Holiday company of San Francisco, will use as his subject "The Future of the Newspaper."

Friday noon past presidents of the association will be guests at a luncheon. The afternoon and evening will be devoted to entertainment with a golf tournament and dinner at the country club, moving pictures of the Oregon-Stanford football game last fall, and dancing on the program. Saturday morning, following con-

mittee breakfasts, John Allen, editor of the Linotype News of Brooklyn, N. Y., will speak on "Modern Trends in Newspaper Makeup" and Elmo Scott Watson, editor of the Publishers Auxiliary of Chicago, will appear in an informal talk.

The annual business meeting will follow, concluding with election of officers.
