DON MOE 'BURNS' TOURNEY COURSE

TACOMA, June 25.—(AP)—Well on his way toward a place in the final match of the Pacific Northwest amateur golf tournament, Don Moe, the Portland links menace, was five up on Jack Westland, Seattle, at the end of 18 holes of their 36-hole semi-final match at the Tacoma country and golf club today.

Moe continued his sensational shot-making of Thursday, clicking out five birdies on the 18 for a 36-32-68, the same medal score he shot yesterday in eliminating Scotty Campbell, of Seattle.

Westland had little chance with the over-heated Moe after turning the first nine one down. His 37-37-74 simply was not in the scoring column.

In one of the most surprising upsets of the week, Mrs. E. G. Griggs, of Tacoma, eliminated Nancy Hurst, Portland youngster who had been sweeping everything before, one up in the semi-final of the women's tournament.

Defending Champion Marten Dougill, Portland, came within 36 holes of her third title in the tournament, stepping into the finals over Olive Lewis, Portland, four and three.

Big Bull Elk Shot To Halt Foraging

KLAMATH FALLS, June 25.—(AP)—State police who went a-hunting for a giant bull elk in the wilderness around Fort Klamath finally tracked down their quarry after a two-day chase, they reported today.

They killed the big animal, which had been chasing fishermen and ransacking grain fields, and spread its carcass along the paths into Fort Klamath to frighten off other elk.

Then they mounted horses and drove a herd of 80 elk back into summer range.

Odds and Ends

Reports to the federal bureau of investigation indicate that every year 100,000 citizens are assaulted, 80,000 are robbed and the homes of 40,000 burglarized.

A federal fish hatchery covering 108 acres will be built at Ukiah, Tex. Vice-President Garner's home town. The hatchery will cost about \$100,000.

NEW ILLNESS HITS HOLLYWOOD STARS

HOLLYWOOD, June 25.—(UP)—A new illness, already affecting six prominent filmstars, menaces Hollywood production schedules, and studio medical staffs fear it may become as prevalent and costly as last winter's influenza epidemic.

According to Dr. Floyd R. Parks, Columbia staff physician, the ailment resembles intestinal influenza, but is not so severe, lasting only four or five days.

Picture people currently ill include Barbara Stanwyck, Jean Parker, Leona Maricle, Roberta Vale and Ray McCarey, director. McCarey's brother, Director Leo McCarey, has just recovered from an attack.

Dr. Parks said the ailment had sometimes been attributed to arsenic sprayed on vegetables which were subsequently not washed with sufficient care, but that the actual cause was probably a sub-microscopic bacillus.

THREE FIREMEN DIE IN GASOLINE BLAST

MONTREAL, June 25.—(Canadian Press)—Three firemen were killed and up to 100 injured today when exploding gasoline in a 2,000 gallon tank blew out the front of a six-story garage here.

The explosion showered bricks and glass hundreds of feet into the shopping district on Laurier avenue.

Business was halted for blocks around the garage.

Every window in houses, stores and apartments in the garage block was shattered. Fruit, groceries and merchandise littered the streets.

Two hundred men of the street department aided firemen and police.
