

**FIRE DAMAGES ROOF  
LOZIER LANE HOME**

Fire early this afternoon destroyed one-half the roof of the two-story residence on South Lozier Lane belonging to John Blass and rented to J. W. Terwilliger. Quick action by the city fire department halted the blaze, after 35 gallons of chemicals had been used.

The fire started at several different spots on the roof, and was probably caused by a defective flue, the fire department reported.

The blaze was discovered by neighbors, who sent in the alarm at 1:20. The city's fire-fighting apparatus was back in the station at 1:35.
