**HOSPITAL CONTRACT TO PORTLAND FIRM**  
SALEM, June 30.—(AP)—The board of control awarded the general construction contract for the nurses home at the Eastern Oregon hospital to Dougan-Hammond Construction company, Portland, on a bid of \$35,666, and the plumbing and heating contract to the Northwestern Plumbing and Heating company, Portland, on a \$10,800 bid. V. D. Reverman, Portland, submitted the low bid of \$34,796 on the general construction job, but agreed to complete the work in 150 days compared with 90 days for the Dougan-Hammond firm.

**UNION PLANNED MARCH ON PLANT, PROBE TOLD**  
WASHINGTON, June 30.—(AP)—Captain James Mooney, sub-commander of Chicago police in the Memorial day battle with steel strikers, testified at a senate inquiry today that a "mob" of union men had tried to "march into the plant" of the Republic Steel company "and maybe kill 200 or 300 men working there." He told the La Follette civil liberties committee he had received an anonymous tip the previous day that the strikers would "march on the plant Sunday."
