Former Ring Star Dies in Portland

PORTLAND, July 2.—(AP)—Tom Tracy, 40 years ago one of the reigning waterweights, died last night from an illness which had afflicted him for several years. He was sixty-five years old.

Born in Melbourne, Australia, Tracy was orphaned at the age of 12 and came to the United States in 1893 as waterweight champion of Australia. He began his American invasion at San Francisco, subsequently fighting Joe Walcott, Rube Ferns, Kid Lavigne, Tommy Ryan, Young Griffio and Mysterious Billy Smith.

In later years he became boxing instructor of the Multnomah athletic club here.

Former Leading Jockey Dies of Heart Attack

Recent good weather has greatly improved all forest roads, and fishing in most streams and lakes will probably be at its best for the season, foresters report.

Officials Remove Photographic Ban On Two Services

HYDE PARK, N. Y., July 2.—(AP)—White House officials today lifted from two news photographer organizations a ban imposed because of pictures taken by visitors at the Democratic "love feast" on Jefferson Island last week and distributed by the two services.

The organizations are the Associated Press, of which Edward Stanley is executive editor in the news photo division, and the Acme News Picture Service, of which Fred Ferguson is president. Ferguson and Stanley visited President Roosevelt here yesterday.

Stephen T. Early, secretary to President Roosevelt, notified the two services earlier in the week they would be put under a temporary ban.

Speakers began arriving at the field early this morning and by noon the airport had taken on a gala appearance with a large crowd waiting in anticipation of the afternoon sky show.

All the planes were lined up along the edge of the field for inspection and guides were on hand to explain the various types. It was the largest display of aircraft ever assembled in Oregon, said Allen D. Greenwood, tour director and inspector of the state board of aeronautics.

The airport had a carnival appearance, with various concessions spotted at strategic points and charter tour bakers shouting the joys of a sky ride over the valley or to Crater Lake.

Along every highway approach were stationed ticket sellers to avert congestion and long lines. At the airport city and state police assisted in the parking of cars and the care of the throng.

First Aid Station

The Jackson county health department established a first aid station in the field. Dr. C. J. Drummond, county health officer, in charge. The doctor was assisted by Blanche Friable, supervising nurse, and Florence Weiser, county nurse. Claude Stevens, city fireman, was in charge of the airport's fire truck.

All the pilots held a meeting at noon to check the sky show schedule and receive final instructions. Capt. Warren Carey was in charge of the meeting.

Arrangements also were made to continue chartered flights throughout tonight. Short hops over the valley and longer flights over Crater Lake were planned.
