

MITCHELL'S NOVEL STILL HEADS LIST AT LIBRARY HERE

Gone With The Wind Remains First Choice—An American Doctor's Odyssey Top Non-Fiction Field

Margaret Mitchell's remarkably engrossing novel of the South during and immediately after the Civil war has not yet gone with the wind. It is still very much in demand and once again was the most popular work of fiction at Medford public library in June.

Although the library has added extra copies to its shelves from time to time, there is still a long waiting list for *Gone With The Wind* and the book seems destined to lead in popularity for some time to come.

Several titles appeared for the first time last month in the list of the 15 most popular works of fiction. Among

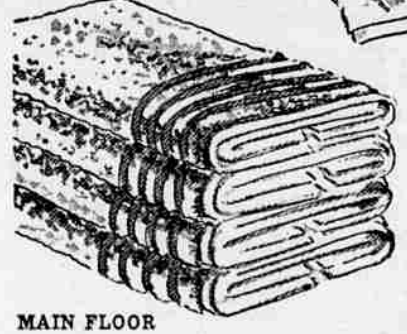
