FEAR IS GROUNDESS IN GIVING TESTIMONY, ARIZONA JUSTICE SAYS

PHOENIX, Ariz. (UP)—Fear of testifying in court is groundless, believes Superior Judge Howard C. Spelman of Phoenix, but he warns "perjury in murder trials can be punishable by death." The tall, distinguished justice said, "there isn't a thing to fear in court—if you tell nothing but the truth." "The same rules apply to all," he declared. "If a person doesn't know the answer to a question, he or she should say so. No witness should stall around and leave the impression he or she is trying to think up an answer." In Arizona, murder trial witnesses whose false testimony leads to execution also can be put to death if their perjury is uncovered, Judge Spelman said. "There is no mystery about being called to the witness stand," he says, "simply be yourself." He recalled a case he once prosecuted in which his "star witness" suffered a severe case of "witness stand fright." The witness, "a typical cowboy who wasn't afraid of the devil," told his story clearly and freely before the trial. He climbed into court and climbed to the witness stand. "I noticed he was a bit pale," the judge said, "but thought nothing of it. I asked him to state his name, and he finally got it out after gulping several times. I asked him several more questions, and he finally answered with considerable difficulty." "Then he seemed to wilt, and asked 'for water.'" "As lawyers and court attaches dashed for water, the witness slumped in the chair and fainted." "He was just plain scared when he faced an audience," the judge explained.

BRITISH PERFECT ANTI-TANK DEVICE

LONDON (UP)—Anti-tank weapons designed to make the British army proof against tank attacks have been perfected by gun experts at Woolwich arsenal. After three years of intensive experiment and research, they have invented an anti-tank gun and an anti-tank rifle which will be able to stand up to tanks and beat them, experts insist. A two-pound shell, fitted with a special armor-piercing nozzle, is fired by the anti-tank gun. This shell can penetrate the armor plates of any tank, and explode inside. One direct hit from an anti-tank gun means death to the whole tank crew and the destruction of the entire mechanism. The gun travels on a small rubber-tired truck and is so light that it can be taken up into the front line. It can be stripped from the truck, mounted on a tripod, and brought into action in less than 30 seconds. It fires with terrific rapidity and can blow up a tank a mile away. The anti-tank rifle is made for use against whippet tanks, and fires special armor-piercing bullets which can bring a tank to a standstill at a range of 500 yards.
