18 AMERICANS IN SPAIN WAR SHOT

MADRID, July 10.—(AP)—Eighteen Americans were listed today among volunteers wounded while fighting with Spanish government troops in the current offensive against insurgents outside Madrid in addition to three Americans reported killed in action.

The wounded Americans were patients in Madrid hospitals but will be transferred to other institutions.

Members of the George Washington battalion said the Americans killed were Jean Bronstein, David Walba and Ray Peters. Their home addresses were not given.

WHEAT PROSPECTS NET PRICE DROP

CHICAGO, July 10.—(AP)—Wheat prices plunged three cents a bushel today as the market reflected the official forecast indicating winter wheat production prospects in general improved the past month. Enlarged buying developed on the break, however, and the market rallied, erasing about half of its loss before the close.

Some of the late buying was associated with a statement of a leading crop authority that the government report apparently did not make enough allowance for damage from rust in some northern and eastern areas of the winter wheat belt. This observer said the estimate of Nebraska production, for example, was only slightly reduced but the federal crop statistician in that state has reported the lowest yield he ever heard of in parts of Burt and Washington counties.

War-Torn Spain Is Locale Rialto Hit

The drama of war-torn Spain has been made the background for a powerful motion picture plot in "The Last Train From Madrid," a star-studded drama which opens a three day run at the Rialto theater today.

With a capable cast of players, "The Last Train From Madrid" is the story of ten persons, most of them unknown to each other, whose lives are suddenly thrown together and their destinies worked out during twelve feverish hours in Madrid while the city is under heavy bombardment.

The main theme is built around Dorothy Lamour, Gilbert Roland, and Anthony Quinn. The latter, Miss Lamour's sweetheart, arranges for her to escape from the besieged city on the last train out. He also secures a pass for his friend, Roland, only to realize that the two are old sweethearts. Unable to leave the city himself, he permits the two to depart for Valencia, hoping that the girl will choose between himself and Roland later.

Aboard the same train is Karen Morley, an adventuress who loves Roland. Despite the peril that surrounds them all she continues to play her game of playing one man against another. Wounded up in the plot are the destinies of Lew Ayres, an American newspaperman.
