Italy Faced With Shortage of Meat

WASHINGTON, July 13.—(AP)—Italy may import 700,000 to 800,000 tons of wheat to meet its domestic requirements, U. S. Consul Lester J. "It is estimated locally that an additional 1,000,000 tons will have to be imported to meet the requirements in Ethiopia," the report stated. "It is expected that this wheat will be imported into Italy for milling and the resulting flour forwarded to Ethiopia."

RETAIL ADVERTISING IN SUBSTANTIAL GAIN
