NEW YORK, July 14.—(AP)—Last hour profit selling nipped a stock market rally in the bud today, with early gains heavily pared or erased.

Even the steel share, which had assumed leadership of the upward climb, slipped as offerings accumulated. Utilities were resistant, but the rally after accumulating modest gains, tilted backward at the finish.

Trading was active in the early hours, then sloped off only to pick up again toward the close. Transfers were about 1,000,000 shares.
