

IRENE CAMPBELL HEADS AUXILIARY OF STATE U.S.W.V.

Installation Officers Closes Convention—Condolences Wired Families of Meier and Senator Robinson

Install Officers. Installation of newly elected officers of the U. S. W. V. was held in the Armory yesterday afternoon, with ceremonies conducted by Robert Campbell, P. M. Rich of Portland was master of ceremonies.

Telegrams of condolence were sent to the family of Julius L. Meier and to Senator Charles McNary in Washington, D. C. to convey to the family of Senator Joe Robinson. CCC BOYS EXPRESS THANKS WITH GIFT TO FOREST HEAD

Gracing the office of Karl L. Janouch, supervisor of the Rogue river national forest, today was a miniature of the rustic tables constructed in an Applegate CCC camp shop for sylvan picnic grounds.

The miniature was a manifestation of the CCC boys' appreciation of their opportunity to receive vocational training. The model table was a gift from them to Mr. Janouch for his interest in their welfare.

In a letter to Mr. Janouch, Claude Vogel, a Camp Applegate leader, wrote: "In behalf of myself and the men who worked with me on the rustic table construction project, we wish to present you with this miniature rustic table. It is made according to standard plans to a scale one-third standard size.

"I should like to take this opportunity to thank you for making it possible for us to work on this project. We have gained much knowledge and information that will linger with us the rest of our lives."

In acknowledging and expressing his appreciation of the gift, Mr. Janouch declined any credit for selection of the CCC men who worked on the rustic table project, saying such credit should be accorded to H. Barnhart, camp project superintendent. Mr. Janouch complimented the boys on their spirit of willingness and co-operation.

"It is this spirit and willingness in performing the duties assigned to you that will make you 'go places' in the future," Mr. Janouch wrote to Mr. Vogel. "I hope that you will continue to work with such a spirit."

The Applegate camp shop worked on the rustic tables during slack periods in the winter. One hundred and four tables were produced and were placed in forest picnic grounds early in the spring.

Medford, immediately following the installation of officers yesterday afternoon, became a deserted city, so far as the hundreds of delegates were concerned. Stages, trains and private automobiles quickly drained the city of Spanish war heroes and their families, who had completely taken possession early Sunday morning and held it through four colorful days of parades, fun and business sessions, stunts, entertainments and convention programs.

Appreciation was expressed on all sides for the excellent reception given the veterans and auxiliary, and to Colonel Sargent Camp of Medford and auxiliary for their splendid work as hosts to the convention. Consensus was that it was one of the finest state encampments ever held.
