LOS ANGELES, July 17.—(AP)—A possibility that the question of the custody of Freddie Bartholomew, juvenile film star, may again be a court matter loomed today.

Miss Myllicent Mary Bartholomew, aunt and guardian of the child actor, lost her contest yesterday to replace the Union Bank and Trust company

as controller of his estate, and during the proceedings counsel for the bank said a suit may be filed to challenge Freddie's adoption.

The court in denying Miss Bartholomew's petition praised her care of the 13-year-old boy, but declared that the bank is a more competent financial agent.

The bank, under stipulations entered into several months ago, handles Freddie's estate, paying his parents, now in England, 20 per cent of his earnings.

GOVERNOR HEADS PROTEST TO NAVY

ASTORIA, July 17.—(AP)—Governor Charles Martin's name headed a list of signatures from members of civic, patriotic and governmental organizations in a formal protest to the navy department today against "neglect" of the Columbia river in the defense program.

The action condemned the refusal to consider the development of an aviation base or defense facilities at Tongue Point. It reminded the secretary of the "unanimous approval" accorded the Tongue Point development by the house naval affairs committee.

The protest became public at a time when 15 cruisers and destroyers are at Portland's inland harbor for the annual "fleet fleets."

Railroad Romance On Rialto Screen Beginning Today
