Star Given "Bum's Rush" At Preview of Her Film

HOLLYWOOD, July 23.—(AP)—Barbara Stanwyck mistaken for an autograph hunter, got "the works" from a policeman—and was rescued by Robert Taylor—at the preview last night of her newest film. An old hat pulled down on her head and her coat collar flipped up, the actress was not recognized by the officer when he shoved back autograph hunters who swarmed around Taylor, her escort. Miss Stanwyck attempted to follow the actor through the crowd. "No, you don't," commanded the officer, forcibly putting her into reverse. "I'm going to sock you, if you don't let her go," threatened Taylor. By this time, the officer was discovering his mistake. So were the fans massed on the sidewalk and angered by his part in the impromptu drama. They jeered when he immediately left the scene. Ironically, he was one of 10 officers hired for the evening by Goldwyn studio, producer of Miss Stanwyck's picture, "Stella Dallas." The Goldwyn press department chief, Jack Lawrence, said Miss Stanwyck suffered bruises on her arms and shoulders for which she received a physician's statement. Taylor was disabused by Miss Stanwyck from filing an official complaint against the officer, Lawrence said. If the star was in tears before the preview, most of the audience was red-eyed afterward. Critics of trade publications and newspaper called her performance as a sacrificing mother worthy of the 1937 academy acting award.

PIONEER PARADE IS HIGHLIGHT OF EUGENE'S FIESTA EUGENE, July 23.—(AP)—The Pioneer walked through the streets of Eugene again today. Today gripped hands with yesterday as the world famous pioneer parade, highlight of the fourth triennial Oregon Trail celebration, proceeded at open-pace through the downtown section of the city with an estimated crowd of 35,000 persons crowding the line of March. Led by a squadron of mounted police officers, the grand marshal of the day was Darwin Bristow, grandson of Elijah Bristow, the first man to build a permanent home in Lane county. In a later float, a reproduction of this cabin was entered by Mr. Bristow, Young, whose grandparents came to Oregon in 1832, and Miss Ida Patterson, whose parents came to Oregon in 1843, had a place of honor near the head of the parade. Close behind came the junior queen and king with their escorts, heading a contingent of children representing an old immigrant train with tiny covered wagons drawn by calves. Queen Susannah IV rode in royal state in the red, blue and gold carriage of the Portland rose festival. With her rode Barbara Johnson, prize girl of the San Francisco Golden Gate exposition, and just behind, riding in an old covered wagon, came the royal court.
