

# Clark Gable, Myrna Loy Head Cast of "Parnell" on Craterian Screen

## IRISH DRAMA WITH MANY STARS OPENS CRATERIAN SHOWING

Hailed as one of the most powerful motion picture attractions in years—and anxiously awaited by hundreds of valley theatre-goers—"Parnell," the tremendously moving fictional drama of Charles Stewart Parnell, "Uncrowned King of Ireland," opens a three day engagement today at the New Craterian theatre. Clark Gable and Myrna Loy are co-starred at the head of a cast of big names.

Gable is shown as the dynamic Irish patriot who sacrifices a glorious career because of another man's wife, and Myrna Loy as that woman, the lovely Katie O'Shea, wedded to a man she despised.

Based on the famous stage play of the same name, but going even farther in emotional depth and sweep, "Parnell" shows the man, as well as the lover. It shows him leaving New York in 1880, to the cheers of thousands of Irish-Americans. It shows him arriving in Ireland where he was the "uncrowned king" and the first man to unite the 86 members of the Irish party. It shows him in the House of Commons, his greatest battlefield. One of the dramatic highlights is Parnell's trial. Accused of inciting murder, he proves his innocence after one of the most sensational trials in English history.

At the height of his career, Parnell, who never looked at a woman, met Katie O'Shea, estranged from her husband. It was love at first sight for both of them. O'Shea sues for divorce, naming Parnell, and the great Irishman, refusing to defend himself to protect the woman he loved, is ruined politically at the very moment he had home rule for Ireland in the grasp of his hand.
