INCUBATOR TWINS IN SATISFACTORY GAIN

Still holding their own in a temporary incubator home today were the twin sons of Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Reabill, while medical science lent modern aid to the difficult task of retaining life in their tiny bodies.

Combined weight of the babies at premature birth Sunday at the Sacred Heart hospital was 4 pounds, 7 ounces. Their condition remains satisfactory, the attending physician reports. They are still eating at regular intervals, he stated. Oxygen has been administered frequently since their birth.

Although premature birth and consequent frailty render their chances slim, survival of the infants for this length of time is considered a hopeful sign, the physician said.

RESERVE OFFICER ORDER MODIFIED

A change in war department orders which will modify the recently announced policy of retaining all reserve officers who have had more than two years COC duty was announced here today.

Under the new policy, 50 percent of the officers will receive extended active duty and 50 percent will rotate their duty on an 18 months' maximum basis.

Although local COC officials had no comment to make on the policy, it is understood the war department change will permit the district commander to retain many of his officers in key positions. Others will be replaced from time to time by other reserve officers, dealing from six months to 18 months active service.
