## BORDER LIGHTS IN AT CITY AIRPORT

Installation of 42 new border lights outlining the main runway of Medford's municipal airport was completed recently, City Building Inspector Frank Rogers said today. Twelve additional lights will be installed when the entire runway is completed in the near future. The lights are spaced 300 feet apart and are 1000-lumen globes, replacing the old border lights of 400-lumen globes. The old lights will be removed next week, Rogers said. The new lights are set in modern prismatic reflectors atop 36-inch high metal cones which measure 30 inches in diameter at the base. The cones are set on concrete slabs, and are so constructed that if a plane hits them they will disconnect themselves and roll free.

## PUBLIC THANKED FOR HELP GIVEN IN WELFARE WORK

Expressing appreciation for the public support received, Miss Helen Carlton today submitted the annual report of the welfare exchange, which operates between January 1 and June 1 as a beneficiary of the Community chest. Aid is also extended by the WPA.

Summarizing this year's work, Miss Carlton noted that it compares very favorably with past years. She stated that demand was somewhat decreased this year.

A total of 2500 garments was donated by the public, the report states. The exchange workshop constructed 67 quilts and 96 garments. Six hundred yards of new material were used.

Women working in the shop numbered 308. The shop was managed by two women sent by the WPA, who were in constant attendance and supervised sewing activities.

The exchange received \$100 from the Community chest, which was added to a \$100 balance remaining from last year. As a result of a chamber of commerce appeal, \$95 was donated by the public. Cash sales in the shop totaled \$23, which was turned back into the purchase of additional material.

New materials cost the exchange \$150. Shop rent amounted to \$122. The women working in the shop were paid 30 cents an hour in credit. Miss Carlton emphasized that nothing was given away from the shop but that women worked for the aid extended them.

Of special interest, Miss Carlton said, was the spirit of cooperation prevailing among the women working in the shop. Frequently, she said, an absent woman would have her place filled by another who would do her work and give the credit to the absentee.
