REMOVAL IS ASKED OF FIRE HAZARDS BY CHIEF ELLIOTT

Medford residents were requested by Fire Chief Roy Elliott today to burn all rubbish and dry grass without further delay. Permits for burning may be procured by telephoning fire headquarters, 845.

"We are entering the serious fire season now and all hazards should be eliminated," Chief Elliott said. "Medford people have always cooperated with the department in fire prevention and we are sure they will this time."

Grass, which is becoming dangerously high in many instances, should be cut away from all houses and buildings stacked in a safe place and burned now, the chief said. Accumulated rubbish, always a hazard because of spontaneous ignition, should also be burned or otherwise disposed of, he said.

All houses and buildings should be inspected also for other fire hazards, the chief stated, pointing out that piled sawdust and other inflammable material present a constant danger. Such material, he said, should be stored in places and in such a way as to eliminate the possibility of spontaneous ignition, cause of many fires in the summer. Attics, cellars and closets should be ventilated, he added, and electric wiring should be inspected.

"The best fire protection is prevention," the chief emphasized. "When it comes to prevention, we need the public's help."

PINNACLE WINS IN TAX SETTLEMENT

WASHINGTON, July 30.—(AP) The board of tax appeals settled for \$27,658 today 13 tax cases heard recently at Portland, Ore. They involved deficiencies totaling \$45,576 assessed by the board of internal revenue.

The board determined the Fir Tree Lumber company, Portland, was \$16,718 deficient in 1931, 1932 and 1933 income taxes. The bureau had assessed the company \$22,928.

Other deficiencies determined by the board and compared with bureau assessments were: The Pinnacle Packing Company, Inc., Medford, \$789, \$2043 income 1933; the Willamette grocery, Salem, \$1430 (\$2539, income 1934).

ASHLAND TWINS SEEN AS PUZZLE FOR ARMY MAN

Roy A. Anderson and Raymond C. Anderson of Ashland were halted today as the first set of twins ever enlisted in the United States army on the same day in the Portland recruiting district.

The twins, brothers of Mrs. Gerald Edwards, Star route, Ashland, were accepted tentatively for enlistment by Sgt. Willis S. Estep at the Medford recruiting station on July 21. They went to Vancouver Barracks, Wash., where they passed their final qualifying examinations and were enlisted on July 26 for service with the infantry in Hawaii. They were to leave last night for San Francisco, whence they will sail for Hawaii on the next outbound army transport.

Delving through records, Maj. H. D. Bagnell, recruiting officer at Portland, found that the Andersons are the first set of twins ever enlisted in this district on the same day.

The boys were born on July 23, 1918, at Epilantzi, North Dakota. They have resided in Jackson county for the past two years. They are said to look very much alike and, dressed in the same khaki uniforms and serving in the same army unit, they are likely to cause some infantry commander many a headache moment.
