

MEDFORD STARS LOSE CHANCE IN WATER HAZARDS

Shot Into Lake Cost Hammond Seven Strokes in Qualifying Round of National Amateur, Portland

Disappointed, naturally, but far from downhearted, Medford's two golfing stars—Bob Hammond Jr. and Leland Clark—returned home Wednesday from Portland where they competed in the qualifying rounds of the national amateur tournament to be held in Oregon's metropolis August 25-28.

With 80 of the state's finest divot-diggers battling for the 15 places allotted for the national amateur,

Medford's two aces were up against a tough proposition. They failed to qualify, Hammond by seven strokes and Clark by 10, but they have no regrets. They shot their golf, and though it wasn't quite good enough, they have no allibis.

"What beat us more than anything else, I believe," Hammond said today, "were the water hazards on the Portland golf club. On the 10th hole on my first round, I overshot the green and landed in a lake. I took a seven on the hole."

Over the 36-hole medal route, Hammond shot an 82-75 for a total 157. It took 180 or less to qualify. Clark carded an 82-78 for a total 160.

Moe Sensational

Don Moe, Hammond said, was the sensation of the tournament. He strung together 30 straight pars, and when he had completed the 36 holes, had a score of 71-70 for a total of 141. He was the low scorer. Scott Milligan followed on Moe's heels with a 143 total.

Comparing the Portland Golf club course with the Rogue Valley, Hammond stated the Portland layout was slightly tougher because of the many water hazards. "You have to be much straighter off the tee at Portland than you do here," he explained.

However, with the exception of the water hazards, the Rogue Valley course probably would be the tougher, he said, because of the difference in size of the greens. Portland has much the larger greens.

Hammond made his tour of the 36 holes with Douglas Nicol of the Portland Golf club, who turned in the same score as did Hammond. George Kill of the Alderwood Country club, where the national amateur will be staged, played with Leland Clark, and shot an even 150 to qualify.

Memorial Interests

Hammond said there was a great deal of interest in Portland in the coming Chandler Egan dedication program to be held in Medford August 22. Several golfers and fans, he said, were planning to attend from Portland and watch Jimmy Thompson, Lawson Little, Harry Cooper and Horton Smith perform.

The national amateur qualifying round which Hammond and Clark entered was the first such tournament held in Oregon in many years. It was also the first the local golfers had ever entered. With so much at stake, it was only natural that Medford's pair of aces should be slightly nervous at first.

"Yes, I was a little shaky during the first round when I took an 82," Hammond smiled.

Discussing the national tourney in August, Hammond said the largest gallery to ever follow the simon-pure was expected. It will be the second time in history the tournament has been staged on the Pacific coast, and Portland is gradually becoming "golf mad," he said.
