

TICKETS ON SALE FOR DEDICATION EGAN MEMORIAL

Advance sale of tickets for the dedication of the memorial to the late H. Chandler Egan went on sale this morning, it was announced by Walter Leverette, chairman of the ticket sales committee.

The tickets are in the form of lapel buttons, and Mr. Leverette expressed hope that citizens of Jackson county will purchase them immediately, especially, as the little yellow buttons on the lapel will act as a good advertising medium.

H. Chandler Egan, twice amateur champion of the United States and a member of the Walker Cup team in 1925, was without doubt Jackson county's most distinguished gentleman sportsman. Mr. Egan had a host of friends all over the world, particularly in golfing circles and dedication of the memorial on August 22 should be attended by everyone in the county interested in clean sports, the committee stated.

The regard with which Mr. Egan was held can be better appreciated by the fact that dedication of the memorial will be conducted by the great Bobby Jones, probably the most outstanding golfer the world has known in recent years.

The dedication service has received the official endorsement of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce and other civic groups in the county.

Accompanying Jones will be Horton Smith, Lawson Little, Johnny Dawson and Jimmy Thompson, outstanding golf players of the United States. They will play a four-ball match and shot making demonstrations will also be given during the day.

"It is fitting and proper that we should honor the memory of an outstanding sportsman, sportsman like H. Chandler Egan," stated Olen Arnsperger, president of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce this morning, "and I sincerely hope that Jackson county citizens, whether they play golf or not, will plan to attend the dedication services."

Immediately following inauguration of the ticket sales Mr. Leverette reported that businessmen and others were responding to the advance sales admirably.

'TWELFTH NIGHT' PLEASES ASHLAND FESTIVAL THROUGH

"Twelfth Night," a rollicking comedy, was presented as the third production in the Shakespearean festival repertoire before an enthusiastic audience in Ashland's outdoor theatre last night.

"Romeo and Juliet," which opened Tuesday evening, will play for the last time tonight and those who missed the first performance will want to see this popular Shakespearean tragedy, smoothly enacted this year by a cast headed by Kitty Ingle as Juliet and T. Arnold Baughn as Romeo. Curtain will rise at 8:30 o'clock and both reserved and general admission seats are still available.

Confirmed Shakespeare enthusiasts who have witnessed "Twelfth Night" in previous festival years, agreed that last night's performance far surpassed the earlier efforts. The actors were keyed to a nice pitch and drew hearty rounds of laughter from the audience as the play swept through one amusing situation after another.

Honors were evenly divided between the leading players. Angus L. Bowmer, festival director, appeared in one of his favorite roles as Sir Toby Belch, a lovably inebriate. John Barker as Sir Andrew Aguecheek, drinking companion to Sir Toby, held up his end of the acting partnership without difficulty.

Dorothy Pruitt, as the rich Countess Olivia, turned in a polished performance, as did Doreen Leverette, who played the charming Olivia. Kitty Ingle, who plays Juliet in "Romeo and Juliet," departed from that gentle characterization to turn in a most performance as Maria, the mischievous lady-in-waiting to the countess.

George F. Smith appeared as Malvolio, the steward in love with himself, and his letter scene was one of the high lights of the play.

Bob Stedman, as Feste the Clown, turned in a sparkling performance, his role giving him an opportunity to sing several numbers. William Cottrill, the festival's assistant director, who directed "Twelfth Night" this year, handled the light role of Fabian, a clownish servant.

T. Arnold Baughn, as Orsino, Jim Parsons as Sebastian, Morgan Cook as Antonio and Harold Reedy as Valentine, carried their parts in their
