To achieve this enviable result you first melt your marshmallows—but that's getting ahead of our story. Here is the recipe and you can see for yourself that mallobet-making is "easy as pie."

Watermelon Mallobet (Serves six)

- 1 1/2 pack-ettes marshmallows
1 cup watermelon juice
1/4 cup lemon juice
2 egg whites
1 tablespoon sugar
1 cup watermelon (cut fine)
Heat marshmallows and 1/4 cup of watermelon juice (made by pressing the pulp through a sieve) in a deep saucepan over a low flame, folding over and over until the marshmallows are smooth and fluffy. Cool. Then add the lemon juice and remaining watermelon juice. Beat egg whites until they hold a peak. Add the sugar slowly and continue beating until a stiff meringue is formed. Combine the marshmallow mixture with this meringue and fold carefully until blended. Pour mixture into freezing tray of mechanical refrigerator and freeze at coldest degree possible, stir twice during the freezing period. The second time add the finely cut watermelon.
