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STARS FROM EUROPE TO FLASH NEXT YEAR IN HOLLYWOOD FILMS

NEW YORK (UP)—Hollywood's new season of motion picture stars, judging from the influx here of players from abroad, and from observations made by authorities in the American film industry.

All are arriving with long-term contracts and some assured prominent parts in their first productions. This influx is unusual since the average newcomer to the American screen, as recently as a year ago, was required to go through a "break-in" period, during which he was given comparatively minor roles until he proved his worth with American audiences.

Some of these foreign players are Frank and Etta Nolan in their new motion picture work upon reaching New York, the first leg of their trip to the west coast.

George Raft, French star and most recent arrival, said almost glumly when asked about the new influx: "I have never been there. How should I know? And I don't want to have my picture before I have seen it myself. I have listened to too many opinions about it already. Some have told me 'You will like it very much,' just as others have said, 'You will like it.' So I go out there with an open mind."

Raft, whose first Hollywood effort will be the role opposite Jeanette Dietrich in her next feature, "Midnight," was an exporter and a bond salesman in Paris before a French producer, meeting him at a party, urged him to take a screen test.

DRIVER TRAINING BECOMES WIDER; SET FOR SCHOOLS

DALLAS, Tex.—(U. P.) W. A. Keene, who instructed 40 teachers how to teach safe automobile driving in a summer course at Texas A. & M. college, will form a driver training course this fall for 500 students at Dallas schools and high schools.

"Instruction in the theory of the rules of the highway and in driving an automobile has a place in the curriculum of the present day high school," Keene said.

"It is best and easiest to train good drivers from boys and girls of the high school age, because their nervous systems are at their best, forming new habits," Keene added, "and the learning period grows longer as the age goes up."

Similar training courses met with success last year in high schools in New York, Maine, Pennsylvania, Ohio and other states. Nine colleges, including Texas A. & M. and Texas Technological college, are offering safe driving instruction courses this summer.

The course at the high school will be worked out with cooperation of the Dallas citizens advisory traffic commission and the American Automobile association.

Keene said the course will be taught with actual automobiles being used in demonstrations and road instruction. The cars will be painted white, with special AAA driver training letters and a set of directional cross-stitch and brake pedals installed in the right hand front seat position for use of the instructor.

Control pedals will be connected directly with the driver's regulation pedals.

Correct clutching, braking and proper shifting of gears are learned by demonstration and road instruction. The use of the dual control, Keene pointed out, and danger of misshifting during the instruction period are stressed.

"To make road instruction practical, practice streets will be selected. Driving situations will be presented to the student. The miniature street layout will include pedestrian crosswalks marked off in white, stop signs, markers, traffic lights, parallel and angle parking and right and left turns.

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
