Creator Of 'Bulldog Drummond' Is Dead
LONDON, Aug. 14.—(AP)—"Bulldog Drummond" is dead.
Lt.-Col. Cyril Maude, creator of the well-known detective character, died today at his home in Fulborough, Sussex. He was 49.
Maude did little writing until he retired from His Majesty's royal engineers in 1919. Then he took the pseudonym of "Sapper" and began writing the tales and plays that won him a wide following.
Probably his most popular character was the urbane adventurer, "Bulldog Drummond," whom he first introduced in 1920.

NEW YORK PLANS RIGID CURB FOR SEX DEGENERATES

NEW YORK, Aug. 14.—(AP)—New York City's fourth slaying of a little girl in five months welded police, legislative, penological and judicial forces today in an unprecedented drive against crimes of sex degenerates.

While the investigation of the latest slaying centered about the story of a 39-year-old WPA project painter who told police he found the body, Mayor F. H. LaGuardia and Police Commissioner Lewis J. Valentine drew plans for a new bureau to keep all known degenerates under continual surveillance.

Police persevered in their questioning of the WPA painter, Samuel Elmore, who told them he found the nude, strangled and ravished body of four-year-old Joan Kuleba in the basement of an abandoned shack in a swamp near South Beach, Staten Island, yesterday.

With the Kuleba case remaining unsolved, city officials seeking to prevent similar attacks, said that under the new police bureau, known degenerates would be brought in for questioning the moment they did anything unusual. Steps would be taken to have them detained for a psychiatric examination.

The mayor proposed in addition that all persons convicted of sex offenses be committed to Bellevue hospital for observation at the expiration of their sentences.

Magistrate Anna M. Kross urged that a psychiatrist and a physician be stationed in all magistrates' courts to examine defendants suspected of sex delinquency.

PORTLAND MAYOR AND BENNETT IN BITTER VICE ROW

PORTLAND, Aug. 14.—(AP)—Mayor Joseph Carson and City Commissioner James E. Bennett became the center today of a bitter dispute over vice in Portland, the mayor challenging Bennett to submit asserted "data" on collusion in the police department to the county grand jury.

Bennett, who charged last Thursday that police were using city automobiles to visit gambling dens and make collections, retorted that it would "do no good" to turn his information over to the mayor or chief of police, who is directly under the mayor.

Carson said Bennett's charges reflected upon the entire department and urged that steps be taken immediately to clear the reputation of the police.

Commissioner O. R. Bean joined the fray by warning that the "police must understand the council means business in this matter, even if the mayor does not." He referred to an order of the city council that gambling be suppressed.

The council's action was based on allegations that lotteries were operating throughout the city and that one youth had lost more than \$700, leading him to steal from his employer.

Police, touring Chinatown early today, made five arrests on lottery charges.
