

American Refugees Leave China With Thanksgiving

SHANGHAI, Aug. 17.—(AP)—Prayers of Thanksgiving were offered on the customs jetty today before the first Dollar line tender left for the refuge liner President Jefferson with 337 American women and children.

It was a strange scene, barren of joy even among those fortunate enough to escape the terrifying bombardments and the threat of hunger here.

There were no shouts of bon voyage, no waving handkerchiefs no steamer baskets, no flowers.

Fathers watching their wives and children sail to safety stood on the pier until the tender disappeared down the river. Then they turned, silently, toward the embattled city.

The women, their faces lined by the strain of long nights of impatient waiting amid bursting bombs and anti-aircraft shells, trudged wearily aboard. Most of them had a suitcase—their only luggage—in

one hand and a child or two clutching the other.

One baby was carried aboard in an incubator.

To identify the tender as a neutral refuge ship, officials stretched a big American flag across the upper deck like a canopy.

It was the craft's only protection against the waterfront aerial, warship and artillery duel between the Chinese and Japanese along its perilous 10-mile trip downstream to the Jefferson's anchorage at Woosung.

Tenders evacuating British refugee women and children were given a naval convoy.

Among those who left for Manila on the President Jefferson were Mrs. Theodore Roosevelt and her son, Quentin. Mrs. Roosevelt said she would return to the United States by the quickest route possible.

Seamen said the tender ran a gauntlet of opposing fire, but that both sides, apparently, respected its strand of mercy.

HIKE INSURANCE RATE ON FAR EAST FREIGHT

LONDON, Aug. 17.—(AP)—Lloyd's underwriters boosted war risk rates today on shipments to the Far East as a result of the undeclared war between Japan and China.

The rate for shipments to Shanghai and Yangtze river ports went from one-quarter per cent to 3 per cent on goods for immediate discharge, but 10 per cent if the goods leave warehouses 15 days after discharge.

Rates also were increased on shipments north and south of Shanghai, Dairen and Manchoukuo ports.

These charges were in addition to rates quoted for some time under a general war risk schedule of a quarter per cent for all voyages.

Japanese Issues Decline Sharply

NEW YORK, Aug. 17.—(AP)—Japanese bonds showed fresh losses ranging up to \$75 a \$1000 bond on the New York stock exchange today as the Far Eastern strife continued. Dealings were moderately active in these issues.

Japanese loans yesterday showed declines ranging from \$10 to \$50.

Uji-gawa Electric Power 7s of '45 were down as much as \$75 each at one time. Japan 6 1/2s of '54 were off about \$60. Great Consolidated Electric Power (Japan) 6 1/2s of '50 were off around \$60.

EXPLOSION NEAR KYOTO WRECKS POWDER PLANT

KYOTO, Japan, Aug. 17.—(AP)—Window panes in more than 800 of the 1500 houses in nearby Uji village were shattered last night when an explosion wrecked the Uji powder manufacturing plant. Three dwellings and two barns burned.

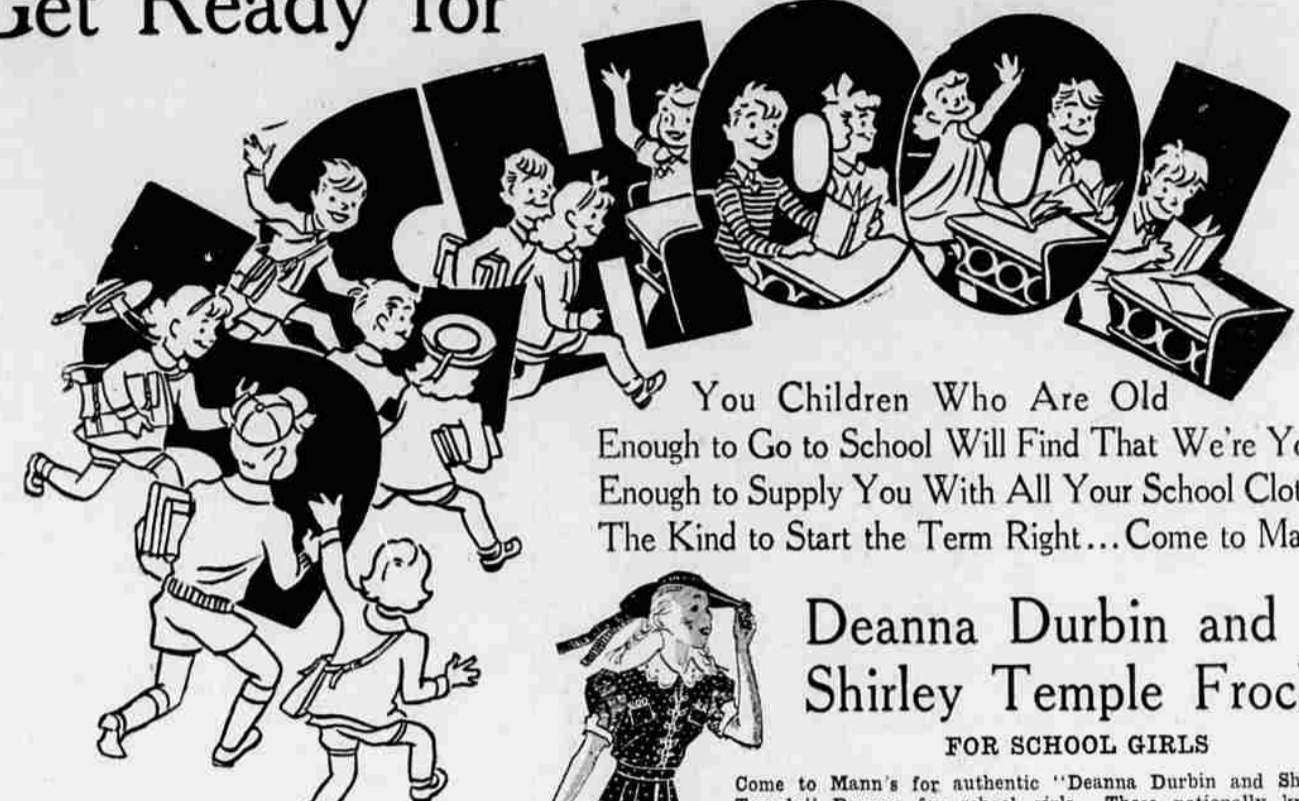

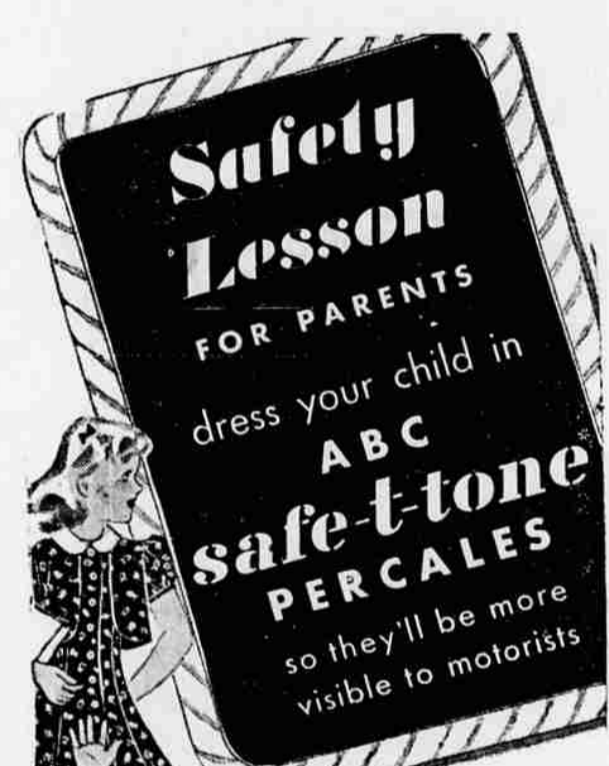
