OREGON PRIEST FINDS GERMANY POOR PLACE FOR CANDID SPEAKING

PORTLAND, Aug. 19.—(AP)—From the inside of a Nazi jail at Schlifstadt, Bavaria, the Rev. Joseph B. Seal, Catholic priest of the Little Flower shrine at Wilsonville, learned the tiny American flag and the United States passport he carried in his pocket were no guarantee of protection in the land ruled by Dictator Hitler.

He said he was accused of holding public meetings because he spoke to friends on the streets and gave a farewell party attended by his brothers and sisters. Nazi officials ordered him not to speak from the pulpit of his native parish, so he spoke from the altar. Then came a general order demanding his silence.
