

# BLACK RECEIVES COMMISSION AS SUPREME JUDGE

### Appointment Presented at Luncheon With President — Wife of Alabama Governor Hinted Successor

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—(AP)—Senator Hugo L. Black received from the hands of President Roosevelt today his commission as an associate justice of the supreme court.

The 51-year old Alabamian, dressed in a white summer suit, left a White House luncheon conference with the president carrying the commission in a cardboard container.

He said he had not decided when, or where, he would take the constitutional oath, or who he would ask to administer it.

He added, however, he thought he would take the oath late today or tomorrow.

He said he would resign from the senate at about the time he was sworn and that copies would go to both Governor Graves of his state and Vice-President Garner.

He said he talked with Graves for about five minutes today but would not say whether his successor as senator was discussed.

He expressed belief, in response to a question, that the court petition to prevent his assuming the bench, filed yesterday by Albert Levitt, former federal judge, would have no effect on his taking his new office.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—(AP)—Mrs. Dixie Graves, 55, wife of the governor of Alabama, was in the capital today, ready to serve her state as senator if appointed by her husband.

Governor and Mrs. Graves arrived by airplane from Montgomery last night. Both refused to say whether she would be selected to fill the vacancy that will be created when Senator Hugo L. Black resigns to join the supreme court.

Alabama congressmen, however, said Mrs. Graves would get the appointment.

# PORTLAND FIRM GETS ELECTRIFICATION JOB

ALTURAS, Cal., Aug. 19.—(AP)—Directors of the Surprise Valley electrification project said they received notification from Washington today confirming a contract awarded a Portland, Ore., firm for the work. The Parker-Schram company was awarded the contract with a bid of \$384,000. The project is designed to serve 640 consumers in Lassen and Modoc counties of California and Lake county, Ore.

Work will start immediately, the directors said. A plant will be built at Alturas to provide power, and poles, wires and transformers will extend 355 miles over the area to be served.

# FARLEY WILL LAY OFF YOUNG DEMO ELECTION

INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 19.—(AP)—Asserting he had received word that James A. Farley, democratic national chairman, would take no part in the election of officers, Alvin C. Johnson of Indianapolis said today he would announce formally as a candidate for president of the Young Democrats of America.

Johnson made his announcement as the annual convention opened here. A short time later Wilford Peables of Youngstown, O., announced as a candidate for the office. He was the second man from Ohio to enter the race and, with Johnson, brought the number of candidates up to eight.

# SIR HUBERT HOPS ON RESCUE FLIGHT

TORONTO, Aug. 19.—(Canadian Press)—The Arctic-bound plane in which Sir Hubert Wilkins and four companions plan to search for the missing trans-polar plane of the Soviet flier, Sigmund Lavrenko, landed at the waterfront here at 2:30 p. m. Eastern Standard time, today after flying from New York.

NEW YORK, Aug. 19.—(AP)—A huge flying boat equipped for Arctic operations left Long Island sound at 11:40 a. m. (E.S.T.) today on the first leg of a flight which will carry Sir Hubert Wilkins, the explorer, into the far north to aid in the search for six missing Soviet trans-polar aviators.

Up to the moment the boat left, Herbert Holick-Kopyov, Canadian flier, who accompanied Wilkins on the Lincoln Ellsworth Antarctic expedition, directed mechanics as they labored hurriedly to equip the 17-ton flying boat Guba for the first flight of its long journey, an overland flight to Toronto Harbor on Lake Ontario.

EUGENE, Aug. 18.—(AP)—A settlement reached in a conference of union, company and city representatives yesterday paved the way for reopening the strike closed Wynnsaw mill at Lebanon.

The peace resulted in the release of C. A. Paddock, AFL lumber union organizer, detained at Lebanon for alleged "riotous conduct." Workers quit their jobs Monday when the company was alleged to have dismissed the union leader. A crew of about 35 men remained at the plant.

# SUMMER STUDENTS PAY \$58,000; COST \$65,000

EUGENE, Aug. 19.—(AP)—Summer students in the Oregon state system of higher education paid in \$58,000 this year against a total cost of \$65,000 to the state for operation of the schools. A total of 611 students attended sessions at Corvallis, Eugene and Portland.
