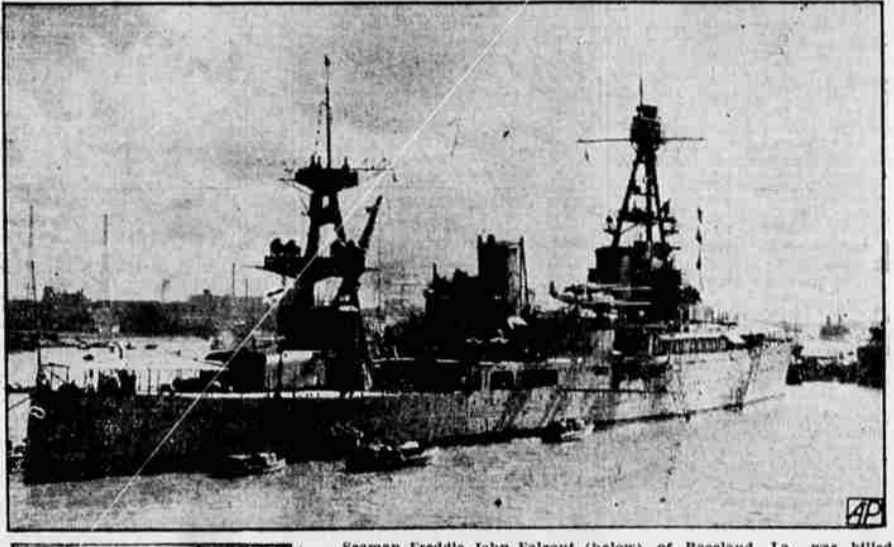
13 FIRE FIGHTERS TRAPPED, BURNED IN SHOSHONI AREA
