

GOVERNOR CALLS FOR OBSERVANCE OF CONSTITUTION

September 17 Listed As Legal Holiday In Oregon - Combat Communism Is Plea.

SALEM, Aug. 28.—(AP)—In recognition of the 150th anniversary of the approval of the United States constitution and recognizing that the state legislature declared September 17 a legal holiday, Governor Charles H. Martin issued today the following statement on the occasion: "On September 17, 1787, the constitutional convention of the American confederation approved the constitution of the United States of America that great document which has become not only our governmental frame but which contains the fundamental principles for which all true Americans have been willing to lay down their lives."

"It is therefore fitting and proper that the people of Oregon should join in the nationwide celebration, and observe the 150th anniversary of this historical and momentous occasion in our national history with proper appreciation for the achievements of the past and development into the future."

"The motive actuating those patriots of 1787 were the same as those alive in the hearts of all true Americans today. It is therefore essential that we bear in mind the high ideals of the motives from which our constitution sprang and which is reflected so eloquently in the preamble: "I, therefore, call upon all citizens of this state to observe Friday, September 17, as the 150th anniversary of the adoption of our constitution, and to urge them to seriously consider the preciousness and value of our rights of freedom of speech, freedom of thought, and the freedom of religious belief, which constitutes our inalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness to the end that our people may thoroughly realize the necessity for united action toward preserving our democracy from the invidious and persistent thrusts of the two most dangerous forces, which are not only alien but opposed to all American ideals—communism and fascism."

The chamber of commerce of the United States, one of the organizations at which he thrust in his Roanoke Island speech, said in its weekly Washington review today that "those who are opposed to centralization and regimentation" must be prepared to continue opposition to certain administration policies at the next session. The organization of businessmen added: "The major issue at stake is clear-cut and fundamental. It involves the question as to whether further powers, such as are embodied in the wage-hour bill, shall be vested in the federal government at Washington."

RICHMOND, Va., Aug. 28.—(AP)—Rep. Dewey Short, of the seventh Missouri district, told Virginia Republicans at their state convention today President Roosevelt had "fed the American people expensive, poisonous propaganda while trying to ease their pain by feeding them palliatives, the cost of which they must ultimately bear."

"The wild, wasteful expenditures of the past four years on temporary and useless projects, on boondoggling activities of inefficient and irresponsible parties, has no justification in law, precedent, or morals," Short declared. He told the convention, assembled to determine the party's future policies in Virginia, that there was a general attitude of "give me, give me, give me, and a feeling on the part of many that the government is separate and apart from themselves."

The Missouri congressman said what "temporary gains" had been made under the "aquander mantics" at Washington were due to "artificial shots in the arm which have prolonged the malady."

FORT WAYNE, Ind., Aug. 28.—(AP)—A person had to be a twin to rate any attention in this northern Indiana city tonight. The man, woman or child who could not point to a double was almost a forgotten citizen, at least for the week-end. Old twins, young twins, fat twins and slim twins were here, there and everywhere, and approximately 3,000 from 15 states descended on this community for their sixth annual national convention. Led by three bands, the doubles marched through the downtown area late today amid tumultuous cheering of those sideline unfortunates who were "just singletons."

Oldest twins in the line of march were Mrs. Henriette S. Billings of Los Angeles and Mrs. F. M. Casby of North Judson, Ind., 81 years young.

SHERIFF THWARTS TEXAS MOB FURY AGAINST BLACKS

TYLER, Texas, Aug. 28.—(UP)—Two Negro youths who admitted assaulting a prominent Longview, Texas, woman last Sunday and robbing her husband, were hurriedly taken from the jail here tonight. Officers, fearing mob violence, were believed en route to Dallas with them for safe keeping. County Attorney Benjamin Woodall of Marshall said he would file charges of rape and robbery with firearms against the two Negro brothers who gave their names as Roscoe Young, 19, and Harrison Young, 18.

Besides the Longview attack, which has aroused much public feeling there, Woodall and District Attorney Oscar B. Jones of Longview said the youths admitted a series of burglaries and car thefts.

NEW YORK, Aug. 28.—(U)—Public indignation against sex offenders reached a climax in a 14th street subway station today when a mob of 1,000 men and women attempted to lynch a man accused of molesting a woman. The crowd beat and kicked the man — John Ploshay, 31-year-old Queens laborer — almost unconscious before police rescued him. He was booked on a charge of disorderly conduct.

Joseph Caocza, 35, of Brooklyn, precipitated the outbreak when he said, he saw Ploshay slap the hips of a woman carrying a baby.

HITLER AND POPE NEAR PEACE PACT

BERLIN, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Reichsfuehrer Adolf Hitler, official quarters hinted today, is on the verge of consummating a truce with the Vatican.

These reports were partially confirmed by the authoritative information that the papal nuncio, Mgr. Messer Orenigio, has conferred at the foreign office with State Secy. Hans Von Mackensen.

Much importance was attached in official circles to the visit. It was the first time since the strained diplomatic relations between the Vatican and Nazi Germany became "frozen" on June 1.

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Naked as a jaybird, as they say in Oklahoma, a man by the name of Cook had a gay time over a wide area today, milking cows, opening pasture gates and turning on irrigation hydrants in San Fernando valley's dewy dawn.

He was going strong until he tried to break into the home of a detective lieutenant, E. J. Clendenning.

Mrs. Clendenning was awakened by the man's howls of delight as he rumped among their horses and calves. She roused the lieutenant, who went out wearing only an undershirt, and shouted: "Hey! What's going there—beat it!"

A. C. Cook—as he recalled his name to be several hours later—then shined up a lamp post and slid right down. He bounded upon the porch, shouted "let me in!" several times, yanked the screen door from its hinges and grappled with the scandalized copper.

As they wrestled out onto the lawn, Mrs. Clendenning came out in a filmy nightgown with handcuffs and a rope, which the puffing lieutenant finally managed to use effectively.

Upon recalling his name at the Van Nuys police station, Cook said he had been in the state hospital in Patton. He was booked as a suspected psychopathic case. "You know," Lieutenant Clendenning said later, "my wife certainly was scared—yes sir, she was afraid somebody would drive past while we were all out on the front lawn with nothing on."

MARTIN RENAMED AUTO UNION HEAD

MILWAUKEE, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Homer Martin, a former Baptist minister, as selected president of the United Automobile Workers of America today after warring factions within the international union settled their differences under a compromise plan suggested by CIO chief, John L. Lewis.

The compromise came hard on the heels of Lewis' plea for harmony in a convention address and the rallying of the union behind a drive to organize 125,000 employees of the Ford Motor company.

The convention delegates, wearied by factional strife of the last week and speeding toward early adjournment, approved of their 35-year-old leader by a unanimous vote of acclamation. The compromise added five executive board members.

STANFORD PLAYER HURT IN CRASH

EUREKA, Calif., Aug. 28.—(AP)—George B. Campbell, 20, Stanford university student, suffered several rib fractures and possibly internal injuries, and Wayne Richardson, 20, also of Stanford and a member of the Indians' football squad, escaped with minor lacerations today when their car crashed into a bank 11 miles northeast of Crescent City on the Redwood highway.

Campbell's father, G. N. Campbell, of Kalama, Wash., flew from Portland to Crescent City in a chartered airplane after receiving word of the accident.
