ASK INJUNCTION TO KEEP PINBALL IN EUGENE OPEN

EUGENE, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Suit to enjoin Sheriff C. A. Swartz and District Attorney L. L. Ray from seizing or destroying pin-ball machines in Lane county was filed in circuit court here today by Frank Dalton, owner of many of the machines in use here. District Attorney Ray recently instructed Sheriff Swartz to make arrests if any of the games are found in operation in the county on and after September 1.

Dalton, in his complaint, alleges that the games have an aggregate value of \$15,000 and that the places in which they are operated are conducted in a lawful manner, the rental paid on the machines being his percentage of profit.

The ground upon which the injunction is being sought is the allegation that these games have not been limited, regulated or prohibited by law and that the license fees required by the city of Eugene have been paid.

NEW FIGHT NEAR WAGE-HOUR BILL

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—(AP)—The United States Chamber of Commerce said today that "those who are opposed to centralization and regimentation (in the federal government) must be prepared to continue their fight on certain new deal policies in the next session of congress."

The weekly Washington review of the chamber, summarizing results of the recently adjourned session, said: "The major issue at stake is clear-cut and fundamental. It involves the question as to whether further powers, such as are embodied in the wage-hour bill, shall be vested in the federal government at Washington."

MAIL COURSE ON STOCKS TABOOED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—(AP)—The federal trade commission has ordered Clement A. DeGrace, trading as social security counselors, Portland, Ore., to discontinue what the commission said were unfair methods of competition in the sale of correspondence courses designed to educate students for positions with the federal government.

The order prohibits representations that positions with the government are available and that examinations for such positions are being held, unless this is a fact. DeGrace also is prohibited from telling prospective students that knowledge of the courses will qualify one to obtain a government position and that he will place students completing the course in such positions, and that money paid as tuition will be refunded if a position in the government service is not obtained.

River Bill Signed WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Approval by President Roosevelt yesterday of the \$54,000,000 omnibus rivers and harbors bill authorized 13 waterway improvement projects in the Pacific northwest with a total estimated cost of \$3,618,800.
