

# RESETTLEMENT IS REPLACED BY FSA; NO NEW PROJECTS

'Farm Security Administration' Will Be Headed by Dr. W. W. Alexander, Secy. Wallace Announces

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2.—(AP)—Secretary Wallace reorganized the resettlement administration today to carry out the new federal farm tenancy program. The name of resettlement was changed to "farm security administration."

Wallace told a press conference that Dr. W. W. Alexander, chief of resettlement administration, would head the new farm security administration.

The secretary also announced formation of a farmers' home corporation to carry out provisions of the tenancy program.

Alexander, Harry L. Brown, assistant secretary of agriculture, and A. G. Black, chief of the bureau of agricultural economics, were named directors of this corporation and advisors on the broad farm relief program.

Wallace said the farm security administration would concentrate on loans and rehabilitation for farmers and abandon model communities, housing and construction activities. The secretary said work on such projects started by the resettlement administration would be completed but no new construction would be undertaken.

Congress provided \$10,000,000 for loans to enable tenants to become farm owners and an equal amount for purchase of submarginal lands this year under the tenancy program.

Wallace said the land purchase and development program would be placed under the bureau of agricultural economics.

Dr. L. C. Gray, veteran land use expert in the agriculture department, and former assistant resettlement administrator, will direct land purchase and development.

# LUMBER EXPORT REDUCED BY WAR

SEATTLE, Sept. 2.—(AP)—The undeclared war in China virtually has dried up lumber exports from the northwest to China and Japan, the West Coast Lumbermen's association disclosed today.

Previous to the hostilities, the association reported, about 50 per cent of Oregon and Washington's lumber exports went to these two countries.

The association said that in 1936 Japan bought 175,464,828 board feet and China 128,850,428 board feet of Oregon and Washington lumber. In May this year the two countries combined bought 45,977,569 feet; in June, 55,512,187 and in July 63,711,383 board feet.

L. E. Force, general manager of the Douglas Fir Exporting and Exporting company, said Japan has stopped buying lumber.

# 9-YEAR-OLD BRIDE BACK TO MOTHER

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., Sept. 2.—(AP)—George A. Williams, a correspondent for the Knoxville News-Sentinel, reported today that Eunice Winstead Johns, Tennessee's 9-year-old bride, and her 23-year-old husband, Charlie, are living apart.

Williams quoted Mrs. Lucy Winstead, the child's grandmother, as saying Eunice had left Charlie and gone back to the home of her father, Lewis Winstead.

The grandmother also was quoted as saying that Charlie had "lit out" declaring he was going to Illinois. "Eunice refused to live in the same house with the elder Johns," she said. "Charlie refused to build a house or rent one somewhere. He would not leave his folks."

Eunice was taken out of grade school by her husband a few weeks ago after she was switched by her teacher.
