

Padres Resume Coast League Pinnacle as Acorns Blast Sacramento

SALVO WHIFFS 11 TO BLANK SEALS; BEAVERS WIN ONE

Portlanders Take First Game in 11 Starts at Home — Bedore's Homer With Two On Proves Big Help

(By the Associated Press.) San Diego resumed leadership of the Pacific Coast league baseball pack today after the Oakland Acorns literally blasted Sacramento out of first place and Manuel Salvo's effective five-hit pitching gave the Padres a 5 to 0 shutout over the San Francisco Seals.

Salvo fanned 11 to raise his total of strikeouts for the season to 169. It was his 17th victory. The Padres had little trouble winning their third straight from the Seals. They converted three hits, three walks and a hit batsman into three runs in the first inning.

Oaks Win, 4-3. Oakland took a 4 to 3 decision from the Senators when Ernie Bonham fanned 12, to retain his strikeout leadership of Coast league hurlers with a 172 total. Merrill May and Jimmy Hitchcock hit homers and Dario Lodigiani smacked a triple in the eighth to score Ernie Koy with the winning run.

Johnny Vergez accounted for two of the Sacramento runs with a circuit clout in the fifth with one mate aboard. The victory was Bonham's 17th.

Portland won its first victory in 11 home games last night when it pounced on Don Osborn for 12 hits to defeat Seattle, 11 to 3. The Beavers started out with a bang to score five runs in the initial inning.

Bedore's Homer Helps. Fred Bedore was responsible for three Beaver runs when he cracked out a homer in the eighth with two on. The win put Portland within three games of the first division.

The San Francisco Mission Reds handed fourth place Los Angeles its second defeat in as many days, rallying in the fifth inning to score twice, break a 1 to 1 deadlock and win, 3 to 1.

Stu Bolen of the Reds was touched for eight hits, but managed to beat down in the pinches.

LONDON, Sept. 3.—(UP)—A record crowd of 85,000 cheered Jack Milne of Pasadena, Calif., as he won the motorcycle dirt track world championship in Wembley stadium last night.

ATHLETES LAST LONGEST IN GOLFING AND BOWLING

MINNEAPOLIS, Sept. 3.—(AP)—The age of greatest athletic prowess is 25 to 29, except in golf and bowling, when it is 30 to 34. This was the finding from a study of 11 leading sports reported to the American Psychological association here today by Professor Harvey C. Lehman, of Ohio university, at Athens, Ohio.

He studied the records of 500 to 600 baseball players from the years 1916 to 1937. In their performances, he said, were 2,980 "player-years," each year being one playing season by a big league player.

The best single year for baseball records in this group, he said, was the age of 28. But the average was 28 to 29. In the earlier years of baseball, he said, the champions were somewhat younger.

In prize fighting, with 183 world champions in all classes supplying the material, the best age was 25 to 29.

In auto racing, the Indianapolis 500-mile race showed the most winners in the 25-29 year ages. The national auto championships, he said, showed 66 percent of the top men between 27 and 30.

For corn-huauing in 85 state huau-

ing championships the winners averaged 25 to 29.

Hockey showed the same ages. Rifle and pistol champions were also the same.

Bowlers were 30 to 34. Duck pin bowlers were the same. Golfers were 30 to 34. The golfers included only the American and British professional champions.

Billiard champions were 25 to 29. Professor Lehman pointed out that the age range in these champions spread from 20 to 55.

Tennis champions, he said, ranged from 22 to 28 for outdoor play and 25 to 30 for indoor. He said there was

no obvious reason for the indoor and outdoor difference.
