TEACHERS LISTED FOR CITY SCHOOL OPENING MONDAY

James Mullins of Grants Pass Succeeds Menegat As Junior High Principal — Many Changes Seen

James Mullins, former principal of the Grants Pass school, has been selected to replace Paul Menegat as principal of the junior high school here. It was announced today by City Superintendent E. H. Hedrick. Menegat resigned to accept another position.

A large number of new instructors will replace familiar faces on the city's school faculty, particularly in the high school. Resignations and leaves of absence will take many away.

Miss Maurine Carroll, for many years dean of women at the senior high school, has been granted a year's leave of absence for graduate work at Columbia university. Also gaining a leave for study at Columbia is Carol Degermark, senior high school girls' athletic instructor.

Miss Mary Brown, senior high school teacher, has a leave of absence to teach this year in the Salem city schools. Carl Howell, last year teaching at the junior high school, has been assigned to the senior high speech department, filling the vacancy left by the resignation of Kenneth Scott Wood, who has accepted a position at Pontiac, Mich.

Miss Ursula Moenberger will be in charge of the girls' physical education department at the senior high school; Miss Catherine Campbell will handle the sewing department in Miss Carroll's absence; Miss Marion Luce replaces Mrs. Gertrude Gates, resigned, in the cooking and cafeteria department; Miss Madge Marean will be in the English department; and Mrs. Josephine Smith will replace Miss Mary Brown in the history department.

Russell Acheson, who coached last year at the junior high school, has been assigned to the senior high teaching mathematics and assisting in the physical education department. George Harrington, graduate of Medford high school and Unifield college, replaces Acheson in the junior high school.

Miss Florence Mothaf, last year in the Jackson elementary school, replaces Miss Lillian Wise in the writing department of the junior high. Miss Wise resigned to accept a position with the Rice Publishing company. Mrs. Helen Everett succeeds Miss Winifred Andrews in charge of the junior high library. Miss Andrews is attending library school in Berkeley, Cal.

A general teachers' meeting will be held in the junior high school building at 9 a. m. tomorrow at which general plans for the school year will be discussed. E. H. Hedrick will preside at the meeting. This will be followed by principals' meetings in several buildings.
