HIGHWAY SAFETY STRESSED LOCAL GOODYEAR TESTS

Residents of Medford last Friday witnessed one of the most startling demonstrations of highway safety it has ever been their privilege to see, when three were purposely blown out on cars traveling at high speed. Instead of a bad accident nothing happened.

The demonstration, arranged by C. C. HAIRY VETCH CUT PROSPECT LOWER

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—(AP)—Government economists anticipated today a reduced production of hairy vetch seed this season because of poorer harvest prospects in the Willamette valley of Oregon, principal producing region.

They reported the valley probably would produce between 5,000,000 and 6,000,000 pounds, or 2,000,000 to 3,000,000 pounds less than August 1 reports indicated. Better yields in Michigan were expected to increase the state's output by half.

Bureau of agricultural economics records showed this country imported 2,073,000 pounds of the seed in July and 1,848,900 pounds in August. The report said the production of hairy vetch seed in Hungary, chief import source, is expected to be less than in 1935.

WHEAT PRICE AT NEW LOW OF YEAR

CHICAGO, Sept. 11.—(AP)—The wheat market plunged 3 1/2 to 4 1/2 cents a bushel at one stage today to new lows for the year but then rallied about a cent before the close.

Liquidation of a line of wheat brought a flood of stop loss and general commission house selling into the pit but enough short covering appeared in the final hour to effect a recovery. The selling was associated with a 2 cents decline at Liverpool talk of increased Russian exports of wheat and lack of satisfactory overseas demand for domestic grain.

A break of 4 1/2 cents in September corn at one time also indicated selling of wheat.

FOOD COSTS DROP IN COAST STATES

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—(AP)—Figures released by the bureau of labor statistics showed today a decrease of 2.8 per cent in August, compared with July, in retail food costs in the mountain states, the drop in the Pacific states being 0.7 per cent.

Seattle showed the greatest decrease with 3.9 per cent. San Francisco alone showed an increase of 0.8 per cent.

CHICKEN PRICES IN AUGUST GAIN

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—(AP)—Chicken producers this week may hope for higher prices than in 1936. It was reported today by the agriculture department, which noted a 10 per cent increase in August over July prices.

Normally, the department said, prices decline a per cent during the period. Present prices, the highest this year, probably will continue at the same or a higher level, the department predicted.
