

Edward Arnold, Francis Farmer In Dramatic Roles At Craterian Today

CARY GRANT, JACK OAKIE APPEAR IN BRILLIANT DRAMA

Based on the colorful life of Jim Fisk, who set Wall Street on its dignified ear with his unorthodox methods of money and stock manipulations, "The Toast of New York" with Edward Arnold in the role of Fisk, opens a three-day run today at the Craterian theater, credited with being one of the finest pictures of the season. Also in leading roles of the cast are Francis Farmer, Cary Grant and Jack Oakie.

Set against the ever-changing background immediately following the Civil War, when the financial moguls of the Street began their juggling of railroad and industrial empires, the play shows Fisk rapidly rising from obscurity and becoming one of that adventurous time's most sensational money barons, a lavish spender, and playboy and flamboyant lover.

Mickey Rooney Has Lead In Schoolboy Picture At Rialto

Every so often along comes a double bill that no one can help admiring and laughing at from beginning to end. And into such a category falls "The Hoosier Schoolboy" starring Mickey Rooney, and "Dance Charlie Dance" starring the biggest collection of top-laugh names in the industry.

The story of "The Hoosier Schoolboy" deals with the trials and tribulations of a young schoolboy, who because he is shunned by his small Indiana birthplace because with his shell-shocked father, lives on the other side of the tracks. How he wins for himself the respect of his neighbors and is helped to happiness by two lovers is the basis of a drama that has every element

of surprise and good old heart-warming, down-to-earth realism. The complications deal with how they try to trim the chump—and how, in the end, the chump gives them the trimming of their lives. Worked in with the comedy angel are a group of musical numbers with many elaborate settings.

CANADIAN WHEAT HIT WORST BLOW

OTTAWA, Ont., Sept. 11.—(Canadian Press)—Total wheat production in Canada was placed at 188,191,000 bushels in an estimate issued today by the dominion bureau of statistics.

The total was made up of 158,899,000 bushels of spring wheat and 19,192,000 bushels of fall wheat.

Of the spring wheat, the crop in the prairie provinces accounts for 164,000,000 bushels as follows: Manitoba, 53,000,000; Saskatchewan, 35,000,000, and Alberta, 76,000,000.

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Sept. 11.—(AP)—Julius H. Barnes, past president of the U. S. chamber of commerce, lashed out at President Roosevelt today in addressing chamber secretaries of Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey in convention here.
