

ADMIRALS DEMAND BELLIGERENTS USE CARE IN GUNNERY

Naval Commanders of Five Powers Warn Chinese and Japs to Spare Lives Innocent Noncombatants

SHANGHAI, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Naval commanders of the United States and four other western powers demanded today that both Chinese and Japanese anti-aircraft gunners take immediate steps to spare the lives of "innocent noncombatants."

The urgent request of American Admiral Harry E. Yarnell and the other neutral naval commanders went forward while Chinese, in the face of wave after wave of Japanese attacks, stood fast on their new inland line stretching 30 miles from Chapei to Liuhong and west of international Shanghai.

Japs in Hinge Offense.
Far to the north the whole might of 125,000 Japanese troops and their modern equipment was thrown into the long-begged offensive against a 100-mile battle line. This campaign, aimed at subjugation of the rich provinces north of the Yellow river, holds the real military importance of the whole undeclared war.

On the altered Shanghai front it became apparent that the Chinese had succeeded in three days of orderly withdrawal in establishing well prepared positions that have halted the Japanese advance just inland from the main city.

But a Japanese army spokesman announced that his forces now were preparing a general attack on Chinese positions along the Tientsin-Pukow and Peking-Hankow railways, the most important lines running from the Yangtze valley to the north.

Yarnell and the other foreign commanders repeated their strong warning to the Japanese and Chinese armies to cease the reckless firing over foreign warcraft in the harbor that is endangering not only the lives aboard the warships but the densely populated foreign settlements.

Furious Battle.
The warning from the senior foreign naval officer in Chinese waters came after a day of furious battle along the northern borders of the international settlement. The admiral of the British and French fleets and the Italian and Netherlands naval commanders backed up Yarnell's demand.

Violent machine gun fire from the concrete nests of China's new defense line northwest of the city mowed down Japanese attacking in an effort to crack the 30-mile front.

Within the settlement itself new fears of the spread of the cholera outbreak were felt. There were 654 cases today and the first British death was reported. The victim was Private Thomas Brown of the Loyal North Lancashire regiment.

POULTRYMEN FAVOR CLEVELAND EXHIBIT

CORVALLIS, Sept. 15.—(AP)—The Oregon Poultrymen's association, closing its 14th annual convention here, went on record favoring a state appropriation of \$5,000 for an exhibit at the world poultry congress to be held in Cleveland in 1939.

The success of Oregon State college in developing the first hen to lay more than 300 eggs in a year inspired the action.

The association re-elected all officers, including Lloyd Smith, Canby, president; P. A. Gent, vice-president; Frank L. Knowlton, Corvallis, secretary, and H. E. Peterson, Junction City, and V. A. Parker, Blachly, directors.

SALEM, Sept. 15.—(AP)—The way was clear today for construction of fishways around the Portland Electric Power company's Casadown dam on the Clackamas river when the state fish and game commission withdrew opposition to the proposal, Governor Martin said today.

Chinese Are Forced Back



In an orderly, strategic retreat, Chinese forces abandoned their front line of defense, shown by solid line, and withdrew to their heavily fortified secondary line of defense stretching northwest from Shanghai, indicated by dotted line. CAMPBELL FINED ON FIGHT CHARGE

James Campbell, a North Dakota dust bowl refugee, charged by Art Geyer, also from North Dakota, with assault and battery, was found guilty and fined \$25 and costs in justice court last yesterday. In lieu of payment he was remanded to the county jail where he is also held on a telegraphic warrant from North Dakota alleging failure to provide for minor children. Campbell declined to waive extradition and is held awaiting further word from Fargo, N. D., authorities.

The assault and battery occurred over the week-end at the Midway Gardens, on the Midway Highway, where both Crawford and Geyer have been working. Testimony showed the fight was the result of a domestic fuss, during which Mrs. Geyer was hit in the stomach by a stray blow. Both men showed mild marks of combat.

tempt to take such cargoes to the Orient, they do so at their own risk. The edict marked the most drastic step taken by the government in the undeclared Sino-Japanese war.

It was proclaimed after the president had conferred with Secretary Hull and Chairman Kennedy of the maritime commission. In the meanwhile, he had canvassed the general Far Eastern and European situation with his cabinet, hurriedly summoned to a special meeting a few hours after his return from an extended visit to his family home at Hyde Park, N. Y.

The president's statement emphasized that the neutrality act was not being invoked at this time, but that government policy in this respect was being kept "on a 24-hour basis."

The neutrality law, which the president must apply once he finds a state of war exists between nations, automatically would bar American munitions exports and financial aid to belligerents.

DALLAS, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Charles Schuize and David Currington, charged on three counts of larceny in a store, forging and passing a check

and possession of a forged check, received sentences of two and three years respectively in the penitentiary in circuit court here yesterday. Currington's longer sentence, Judge Arlie G. Walker said, was given in view of a previous offense.

Funeral services will be held at the Perl Funeral Home Friday at 2 p. m. Reverend Jones of Jacksonville officiating. Interment will take place in the Jacksonville cemetery.

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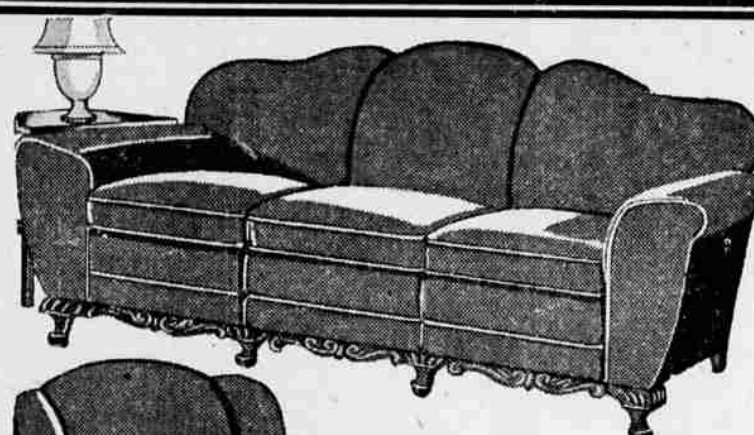
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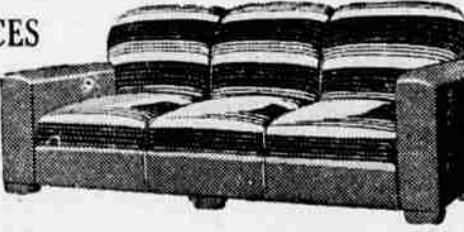
