

COUNSEL BLAMES TAX PROBE FOR JOB LOSS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Morrison Shafroth said today he had been forced out of his position as chief counsel of the Internal revenue bureau because he refused to join the recent investigation of tax avoidance and evasion.

Shortly after Shafroth's resignation had been announced by Secretary Morgenthau, Shafroth issued a brief statement saying that he and his assistant, Russel J. Ryan, had been given "the choice of participating in the presentation of the names of alleged tax evaders and avoiders" or resigning.

As a result, Shafroth said, "we tendered our resignations on the 28th of June, 1937."
