ISOLATION HOUSE
FOR T. B. VICTIMS
NOW ON DISPLAY

Being exhibited on the court house lawn is first of the small structures sponsored by the Jackson County Health association as isolation houses for tuberculosis victims.

The small house is designed to shelter patients awaiting admission to state institutions, providing adequate and healthful facilities and at the same time protecting members of the patient's family from contracting the disease. The house is believed the first of its kind west of the Mississippi with possible exceptions in Arizona.

The wooden structure was paid for by the health association, designed by Dr. C. I. Drummond, former county health officer, and constructed by boys in the manual training classes at the senior high school, under supervision of Leland Meunier.

White paint and green trim add to attractiveness of the miniature house. Interior dimensions are 8 by 9 feet, with room for a bed, bed stand, chair and the usual dining cooler, weather. Large casement windows line three walls, providing large amounts of air and sunshine. The house is portable and when in use will be located close to the home of the patient.

A second house has been completed by the Kiwanis club, members donating both money and labor. Both houses will be put into immediate use.

The house now on display will remain on the court house grounds for the ensuing week in order that citizens may have an opportunity for inspecting it. It will be loaned out by the health association, with the health department in care of it.
