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CRAFT FINDS BODY | **CATTLE PRICE HIGHEST**
AGNESS PIONEER | **WITHIN PAST 18 YEARS**

GRANTS PASS, Sept. 23. — (P) — Hathaway Jones, 67, colorful mail carrier and story teller of Agness, one of the west's last frontiers, was dead today.

For the past 30 years he rode a mule and carried mail from Agness, to which a precarious road was built this year, upstream along the Rogue.

Yesterday his mule returned riderless and without a saddle. A searching party headed by Lt. Roy Craft, temporary commander of Agness CCC camp, found his body at the base of a 25 foot cliff, his skull crushed against a rock.

CHICAGO, Sept. 23. — (P) — The highest cattle price in 18 years, \$19.50 per hundredweight—was paid in the Chicago livestock market yesterday.

With one exception it was the top steer price of record for September. It surpassed all previous peaks in the cattle trade since December, 1919, when \$21.50 bought a load of choice steers.

Scarcity of grain fed steers in the face of a brisk demand was the basis of the advance.
